A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5 6	Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study the issue of the most efficient and effective manner to provide information to the residents of this Commonwealth that clearly and concisely outlines the animal control responsibilities of State and local agencies and any nonprofit organizations.
7	WHEREAS, Residents throughout this Commonwealth face a
8	variety of issues involving domestic and wild animals on a daily
9	basis; and
10	WHEREAS, These issues can range widely from the discovery of
11	a lost dog to a suspected case of animal cruelty or a suspected
12	case of rabies in an animal to the presence of wild animals in
13	attics, basements and homes; and
14	WHEREAS, While these situations are often not emergencies
15	that rise to the proper level of a 911 call, they are still of
16	significant concern to residents; and
17	WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians often find it difficult to ascertain
18	whom to call due to the several State and local regulatory and
19	law enforcement agencies assigned to enforce Pennsylvania's
20	separate animal-related laws and regulations; and

1 WHEREAS, Officials within Pennsylvania's animal-related 2 agencies and nonprofit organizations attest to the frustration 3 borne by residents who often are referred numerous times and 4 make numerous telephone calls before finding the solution to 5 their respective problems; and

6 WHEREAS, In attempting to solve these issues, Pennsylvania 7 residents want to contact the correct agency immediately in the 8 interest of public safety and in the animals' best interests; 9 and

10 WHEREAS, The current lack of clear information as to whom to 11 call not only frustrates Pennsylvanians but unnecessarily causes 12 delays in addressing their situations; and

13 WHEREAS, In some situations, this lack of information results 14 in the problem not being addressed; therefore be it

15 RESOLVED, That the Senate direct the Joint State Government 16 Commission to study the issue of the most efficient and 17 effective manner to provide information to the residents of this 18 Commonwealth that clearly and concisely outlines the animal 19 control responsibilities of State and local agencies and any 20 nonprofit organizations; and be it further

21 RESOLVED, That the study to be conducted by the Joint State
22 Government Commission include a report of the following:

(1) The current animal control statutes and regulations
 in this Commonwealth and whether those statutes and
 regulations provide the public with information on the animal
 control responsibilities of the agencies and organizations.

(2) The current animal control statutes and regulations
in other states that provide clear and concise information on
the animal control responsibilities of State and local
agencies and any nonprofit organizations;

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1 and be it further

2 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission prepare 3 a final report to include findings and recommendations to implement necessary changes in State statutes, practices, 4 policies and procedures to efficiently and effectively provide 5 the public with clear and concise information on the animal 6 7 control responsibilities of State and local agencies and 8 nonprofit organizations and necessary contact information; and 9 be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the final report include an analysis of the 11 potential effectiveness and efficiency of establishing the 12 following:

(1) A regional or countywide telephone number that would
 accept all animal control telephone calls and direct them to
 the appropriate animal control agency or organization.

16 (2) A publicly accessible Internet website that can 17 either direct the public to or inform the public of the 18 appropriate animal control agency or organization; 19 and be it further

20 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue 21 the report to the Senate with its findings and recommendations 22 no later than one year after the adoption of this resolution.

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
