## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of March 2017 as "Spread the Word to End the Word Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Individuals with intellectual and developmental
- 4 disabilities have unique gifts and talents to share with their
- 5 families, friends and communities; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Individuals with intellectual and developmental
- 7 disabilities enjoy sharing life experiences, including listening
- 8 to music, playing video games, watching the latest movies and
- 9 having fun, as well as working together toward athletic
- 10 excellence, mutually enriching one-to-one friendships and
- 11 contributing to society in many ways; and
- 12 WHEREAS, As much as 3% of the world's population, 200 million
- 13 people, have intellectual disabilities, the largest disability
- 14 population in the world; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The demeaning use of the words "retard" or
- 16 "retarded," also known as the "R-words," are common taunts or
- 17 may often unwittingly be used to denote behavior that is clumsy,
- 18 hapless and even hopeless, whether intentional or not; and

- 1 WHEREAS, These words conjure up a painful stereotype of
- 2 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, "Spread the Word to End the Word" is an ongoing
- 5 effort by Special Olympics, Best Buddies and other supporters to
- 6 inspire respect and acceptance through raising the consciousness
- 7 of society about how hurtful words and disrespect can be toward
- 8 individuals with intellectual disabilities; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians can help eliminate the demeaning use
- 10 of these words from current youth vernacular, creating a more
- 11 accepting world for individuals with intellectual and
- 12 developmental disabilities and recognizing that these
- 13 individuals have unique gifts and talents to share; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Young people can raise awareness of the dehumanizing
- 15 and hurtful effects of the words "retard" or "retarded," also
- 16 known as the "R-words," encouraging others to think before they
- 17 speak; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of March 2017
- 19 as "Spread the Word to End the Word Month" in Pennsylvania and
- 20 encourage all residents to work within their communities to
- 21 eliminate the use of the words "retard" and "retarded" and to
- 22 increase awareness, understanding and respect for individuals
- 23 with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
