A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of March 2019 as "American Red Cross Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, More than 137 years ago, the American Red Cross was
- 4 established as a humanitarian organization, guided by seven
- 5 fundamental principles, including humanity, impartiality and
- 6 independence, to provide services to those in need regardless of
- 7 race, religion, gender, sexual orientation or citizenship
- 8 status; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Today, the American Red Cross is one of the largest
- 10 humanitarian organizations in the world and delivers its mission
- 11 every day to prevent and alleviate human suffering in the face
- 12 of emergencies; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross shelters, feeds and provides
- 14 emotional support to victims of disasters, supplies about 40% of
- 15 the nation's blood, teaches skills that save lives, provides
- 16 international humanitarian aid and supports military members and

- 1 their families; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Every year, the American Red Cross responds to an
- 3 average of more than 62,000 disasters across the country, from
- 4 small home fires to devastating massive disasters; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Last year's large crises included mudslides in
- 6 California, a volcano in Hawaii, wildfires in Colorado and
- 7 California, destructive hurricanes in Florida and the Carolinas
- 8 and a devastating typhoon in United States' territories; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Thousands of American Red Cross volunteers,
- 10 including many from Pennsylvania, provided around-the-clock
- 11 shelter for disaster victims, served millions of meals and
- 12 snacks and distributed millions of relief items; and
- WHEREAS, Of the 12,842,441 individuals who resided in this
- 14 Commonwealth, 6,600 served as volunteers for the American Red
- 15 Cross; and
- 16 WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, the Red Cross has a long history of
- 17 helping our neighbors in need and, in 2018, the Red Cross
- 18 assisted with 2,116 disasters that affected more than 4,000
- 19 families and 11,000 people Statewide; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross installed nearly 20,000 free
- 21 lifesaving smoke alarms in almost 9,000 homes across this
- 22 Commonwealth to help families escape in the event of a fire; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross served thousands of active
- 24 duty military, their families and veterans with more than 11,000
- 25 case services through their Service to Armed Forces program; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The Red Cross collected nearly 250,000 blood
- 27 donations to meet the needs of accident victims, cancer
- 28 patients, surgical candidates, children with blood disorders and
- 29 others; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross trained 186,000 individuals

- 1 across this Commonwealth in first aid, the proper way to perform
- 2 CPR or the use of an automatic external defibrillator, water
- 3 safety, caregiving and more; and
- WHEREAS, The Red Cross provided more than 1,000,000
- 5 elementary school students nationally with training on how to
- 6 prepare for emergencies through The Pillowcase Project;
- 7 therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of March 2019
- 9 as "American Red Cross Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Senate commend the American Red Cross and
- 11 all of its employees and volunteers for their service and
- 12 dedication to the communities and residents of this
- 13 Commonwealth.
