A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the month of April 2023 as "Alcohol Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Most adults in the United States who drink alcohol
4	do so moderately and without complications, yet alcohol-related
5	problems are among the most significant public health issues in
6	the country; and
7	WHEREAS, Alcohol use disorder (AUD) affects about 15 million
8	adults in the United States; and
9	WHEREAS, According to the National Institutes of Health, an
10	estimated 140,000 people die from alcohol-related causes
11	annually, making alcohol the fourth leading preventable cause of
12	death in the nation; and
13	WHEREAS, Each April since 1987, the National Council on
14	Alcoholism and Drug Dependence, Inc., has sponsored "Alcohol
15	Awareness Month" to increase public awareness and understanding,
16	reduce stigma and encourage local communities to focus on
17	alcohol use disorder and alcohol-related issues; and
18	WHEREAS, Adolescent drinking is a serious public health

1 problem in the United States; and

2 WHEREAS, According to the 2019 National Survey on Drug Use 3 and Health, an estimated 414,000 adolescents 12 to 17 years of 4 age had AUD; and

5 WHEREAS, According to the same study, nearly 7 million people 12 to 20 years of age reported drinking alcohol in the past 6 7 month and approximately 825,000 people 12 to 20 years of age 8 reported heavy alcohol use in the past month; and 9 WHEREAS, Alcohol use during the teenage years can interfere 10 with normal adolescent brain development, increase the risk of developing AUD and lead to unintended consequences such as 11 12 injury, sexual assault, alcohol overdose and death; therefore be 13 it

14 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2023 15 as "Alcohol Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and be it further 16 RESOLVED, That the Senate inform Pennsylvanians of the 17 dangers associated with alcohol use and abuse in adults and 18 children.
