A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of May 5 through 11, 2019, as "Drinking Water Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, While 71% of the earth's surface is covered with
- 4 water, only 3.5% of that water is suitable for human
- 5 consumption; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Groundwater, the water that soaks into the soil from
- 7 raindrops and moves downward to fill cracks and other openings
- 8 in beds of rock and sand, makes up approximately 30% of the
- 9 freshwater on earth, not including polar ice caps; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Individual water wells tapping groundwater resources
- 11 provide high-quality water to many homeowners and businesses;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, Few people consider water supply when choosing a
- 14 home or when taking a stand on local water supply regulations;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, There are 1,949 municipally owned or investor-owned
- 17 community drinking water systems that provide high-quality water

- 1 to homeowners and businesses; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The Department of Environmental Protection upholds
- 3 Federal and State drinking water standards for all of those
- 4 systems; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission regulates
- 6 the rates and service of investor-owned water companies in this
- 7 Commonwealth; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The mission of the Pennsylvania Public Utility
- 9 Commission is to ensure that safe and reliable service is
- 10 provided to ratepayers at a reasonable price; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority
- 12 (PENNVEST) provides low-cost financial assistance for
- 13 infrastructure improvements to community drinking water systems;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, Ongoing cooperation among the Department of
- 16 Environmental Protection, the Pennsylvania Public Utility
- 17 Commission and PENNVEST strengthens drinking water system
- 18 viability, enhances service, increases economies of scale,
- 19 regionally maximizes efficient water supply and use and fosters
- 20 economic development; and
- 21 WHEREAS, A State water plan has been developed to coordinate
- 22 regional, county and local water allocation and use, land
- 23 development planning and related zoning requirements under Act
- 24 220 of 2002; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The American Water Works Association established
- 26 "National Drinking Water Week" more than 40 years ago to call
- 27 attention to water as a precious natural resource; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Water conservation and water quality maintenance are
- 29 essential to this Commonwealth and our nation; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Many of us take for granted the instantaneous

- 1 availability 24 hours a day of a safe and reliable drinking
- 2 water service provided by viable community drinking water
- 3 systems; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of May 5 through
- 5 11, 2019, as "Drinking Water Week" in Pennsylvania to heighten
- 6 awareness of drinking water treatment, monitoring, distribution
- 7 and related costs and urge all residents of this Commonwealth to
- 8 protect our watersheds, conserve our precious drinking water
- 9 supply and preserve its superior quality.
