RELATING TO ELECTIONS -- ELECTIVE MEETINGS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 17-18-11 of the General Laws in Chapter 17-18 entitled "Elective 2 Meetings" is hereby amended to read as follows: 17-18-11. Time of closing of polls. -- Elective meetings in all cities and towns shall be 3 4 continuously kept open for voting until 9 8:00 p.m.; provided, that any qualified voter who is 5 within the building in which the elective meeting is being conducted and is waiting in line to vote at 9 8:00 p.m. shall be entitled to cast his or her vote. When all persons entitled to vote have been 6 7 afforded a reasonable opportunity to do so, the polls shall be closed; provided, that the city council of the city of Pawtucket shall have the authority, solely in local elections, to close the 8 9 polls one hour earlier than set forth in this section. 10 SECTION 2. Sections 17-20-8, 17-20-16, 17-20-21, 17-20-22 and 17-20-25 of the 11 General Laws in Chapter 17-20 entitled "Mail Ballots" are hereby amended to read as follows: 12 <u>17-20-8. Application for ballot. --</u> (a) Whenever any person is unable to sign his or her 13 name because of physical incapacity or otherwise, that person shall make his or her mark "X".

(c) The local board shall maintain a separate list of names and addresses of all applicants

(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter as to time and manner thereof, it

shall be the duty of the applicant to cause the mail ballot application or the emergency mail ballot

application, as the case may be, to be processed by the local board so that the applicant may

receive the ballot, cast it, and cause delivery thereof to be made to the state board not later than

nine o'clock (9:00) eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. on the date of election.

and their subscribing witnesses and a copy of the list shall be made available for inspection to any
person upon request.
(d) Any person knowingly and willfully making a false application or certification or
knowingly and willfully aiding and abetting in the making of a false application or certification
shall be guilty of a felony.
<u>17-20-16. Time of casting vote</u> Mail ballots may be cast in the manner provided by
law on or before election day; provided, that no mail ballot shall be counted unless it is received
by the state board not later than nine o'clock (9:00) eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. local time on
election day.
<u>17-20-21. Certifying envelopes</u> The secretary of state shall cause to be prepared and
printed and shall furnish with each mail ballot an envelope for sealing up and certifying the ballot
when returned. The envelope shall be printed in substantially the following form:
"After marking ballot or ballots, fold and enclose in this envelope and seal it. Certify to
statement hereon. Enclose in envelope addressed to board of elections, which must receive the
envelope not lager than nine o'clock (9:00) eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. the day of election."

10	has not cast it shall nevertheless return the unvoted ballot and its uncertified enclosing envelope
11	to the state board or local board with a statement that the voter is not using the mail ballot, before
12	nine o'clock (9:00) eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. on election day.
13	SECTION 3. Section 17-22-1 of the General Laws in Chapter 17-22 entitled "Tabulation
14	and Certification of Returns by State Board" is hereby amended to read as follows:
15	17-22-1. Commencement and continuance of tabulations The state board shall
16	commence the counting, canvassing, and tabulating of all votes cast, including mail ballots, at
17	nine o'clock (9:00) eight o'clock (8:00) p.m. on any election day at which mail ballots may be
18	cast and within twenty-four (24) hours after any other election or primary, and shall continue and
19	complete the tabulation with all reasonable expedition by using an optical scan count system.
20	SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon passage.
