RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT - UNIFORM UNSWORN FOREIGN DECLARATIONS ACT

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 42 of the General Laws entitled "STATE AFFAIRS AND
2	GOVERNMENT" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	CHAPTER 26.3
4	UNIFORM UNSWORN FOREIGN DECLARATIONS ACT
5	42-26.3-1. Short title This chapter shall be known as the "Uniform Unsworn Foreign
6	Declarations Act."
7	42-26.3-2. Definitions As used in this chapter:
8	(1) "Boundaries of the United States" means the geographic boundaries of the United
9	States, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, and any territory or insular possession
10	subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
11	(2) "Law" means the federal or a state constitution, a federal or state statute, a judicial
12	decision or order, a rule of court, an executive order, and an administrative rule, regulation, or
13	<u>order.</u>
14	(3) "Record" means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium or that is stored in
15	an electronic or other medium and is retrievable in perceivable form.
16	(4) "Sign" means, with present intent to authenticate or adopt a record:
17	(i) To execute or adopt a tangible symbol; or
18	(ii) To attach to or logically associate with the record an electronic symbol, sound, or

1	process.
2	(5) "State" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the
3	United States Virgin Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of
4	the United States.
5	(6) "Sworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record given under oath. The
6	term includes a sworn statement, verification, certificate, and affidavit.
7	(7) "Unsworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record that is not given under
8	oath, but is given under penalty of perjury.
9	42-26.3-3. Applicability This chapter applies to an unsworn declaration by a declarant
10	who at the time of making the declaration is physically located outside the boundaries of the
11	United States whether or not the location is subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. This
12	chapter does not apply to a declaration by a declarant who is physically located on property that is
13	within the boundaries of the United States and subject to the jurisdiction of another country or a
14	federally recognized Indian tribe.
15	42-26.3-4. Validity of unsworn declaration (a) Except as otherwise provided in
16	subsection (b), if a law of this state requires or permits use of a sworn declaration, an unsworn
17	declaration meeting the requirements of this chapter has the same effect as a sworn declaration.
18	(b) This chapter does not apply to:
19	(1) A deposition;
20	(2) An oath of office;
21	(3) An oath required to be given before a specified official other than a notary public;
22	(4) A declaration to be recorded pursuant to chapter 5-20-8; or
23	(5) An oath required by chapter 33-7.
24	42-26.3-5. Required medium If a law of this state requires that a sworn declaration be
25	presented in a particular medium, an unsworn declaration must be presented in that medium.
26	42-26.3-6. Form of unsworn declaration An unsworn declaration under this chapter
27	must be in substantially the following form:
28	I declare under penalty of perjury under the law of Rhode Island that the foregoing is true
29	and correct, and that I am physically located outside the geographic boundaries of the United
30	States, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, and any territory or insular possession
31	subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.

7	42-26.3-7. Uniformity of application and construction In applying and construing
8	this chapter, consideration must be given to the need to promote uniformity of the law with
9	respect to its subject matter among states that enact it.
10	42-26.3-8. Relation to electronic signatures in global and national commerce act
11	This chapter modifies, limits, and supersedes the federal Electronic Signatures in Global
12	and National Commerce Act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001, et seq., but does not modify, limit, or
13	supersede Section 101(c) of that act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001(c), or authorize electronic delivery
14	of any of the notices described in Section 103(b) of that act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7003(b).
15	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
