HOUSE RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING PROFOUND SYMPATHY ON THE PASSING OF REV. JOSEPH LUKE LENNON

1 WHEREAS, It is with great sadness that this House has learned of the passing of Rev. Joseph Luke Lennon, a revered and beloved member of the Dominican Friars of the Eastern 2 3 Province of St. Joseph and of the Dominican Community at Providence College; and 4 WHEREAS, Born in Providence, a son of the late John and Marjorie Charlotte Lennon, Reverend Lennon graduated from LaSalle Academy and Providence College before entering the 5 Dominican novitiate at St. Rose Priory. He studied for two years at St. Joseph Priory and earned 6 7 his bachelor's and licentiate degrees in sacred theology from the College of the Immaculate 8 Conception/Dominican House of Studies; and WHEREAS, Rev. Lennon was ordained to the holy priesthood on June 5th of 1947, by the 9 10 Most Rev. Archbishop Amleto Cicognani, D.D. He continued his education, earning an M.A. in 11 psychology from the Catholic University of America and his Ph.D. in education from the 12 University of Notre Dame. In addition, he earned an honorary M.A. degree from Providence 13 College, Doctor of Letters degrees from Bradford Durfee College of Technology and Southeastern Massachusetts University, and a Doctor of Humane Letters from Roger Williams 14 15 College; and 16 WHEREAS, In 1949, Rev. Lennon joined the faculty at Providence College. He taught education, theology, and philosophy, and held a myriad of administrative positions until his 17 retirement in 1968; and

WHEREAS, In addition to his responsibilities at Providence College, Rev. Lennon

1	served on numerous state education and health committees. He also was a member of the Boards
2	of Rhode Island Hospital and Blue Cross-Blue Shield of Rhode Island, and an arbitrator for the
3	Rhode Island Department of Labor; and
4	WHEREAS, For many years, Reverend Lennon served as the diocesan representative to
5	Italian speaking civic-religious organizations. He also received numerous honors and awards
6	from civic organizations, such as Big Brothers of Rhode Island, and was named "Man of the
7	Year" by the Verrazzano Day Committee; and
8	WHEREAS, Reverend Lennon was widely published. He wrote books on education and
9	sociology, and articles, reprints, book reviews, commentaries, and letters to the editor. He also
10	served as the op-ed writer for the Providence Visitor/Rhode Island Catholic and was a frequent
11	public speaker and television and radio personality; and
12	WHEREAS, In addition to his teaching, writing, and community work, Rev. Lennon was
13	an avid golfer and three-time winner of the Rhode Island State Seniors' Gold Association
14	Championship. He is survived by his nieces Marjorie Reidy, Judith Cafferty, Jane McClanaghan,
15	Barbara McFarland, and Kathy Lennon, and his nephews Ralph, Joseph, and Robert Lennon; and
16	WHEREAS, Reverend Lennon lived his life vigorously, educating and reaching out to
17	those in need of his wisdom and guidance. He was a good soul who left this world a far better
18	place because of his life's work and he was an inspiration to us all; now, therefore be it
19	RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island and
20	Providence Plantations hereby expresses our deepest sympathies on the passing of Rev. Joseph
21	Luke Lennon, O.P. He will forever be remembered as an educator, a gifted orator and writer, and
22	a community and spiritual leader; and be it further
23	RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and he hereby is authorized and directed to
24	transmit a duly certified copy of this resolution to the Providence College Office of Institutional
25	Advancement in Providence, Rhode Island.
