It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 42-61 of the General Laws entitled "State Lottery" is hereby

2 amended by adding thereto the following section:

3 <u>42-61-18. Scratch-A-Tick game. – During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 the state</u>

lottery division within the department of revenue shall conduct, in conformity with the applicable

5 provisions of chapter 42-61 of the general laws, an instant game to be known as "Scratch-A-Tick

6 Game." The lesser of either the net revenue from the first three (3) months of the running of the

7 "Scratch-A-Tick Game" or two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be deposited in a

8 restricted revenue account to be used by the University of Rhode Island Center for Vector-Borne

9 Disease and Tick Encounter Resource Center for tick-bite protection and disease prevention

research and outreach. The provisions of this section shall prevail over any provisions of chapter

11 42-61 which are inconsistent therewith.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

2	"Scratch-A-Tick Game" during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011. The lesser amount of either
3	the net revenue from the first three (3) months of the running of said game or two hundred
1	thousand dollars (\$200,000) shall be deposited in a restricted revenue account to be used by the
5	University of Rhode Island for Vector-Borne Disease and Tick Encounter Resource Center to
5	help support statewide tick-bite protection and Lyme disease prevention research and outreach.
7	This act would take effect upon passage.
