It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Legislative findings. The general assembly hereby finds that the current 2 economic conditions in the real estate market demonstrate that there is little or no demand for 3 new construction. In addition, the banking crisis has made it extremely difficult for real estate 4 developers to obtain financing for new real estate construction. Currently, there are real estate 5 developers who have expended substantial amounts of money to obtain permits and approvals from various local and state agencies. Many of the permits and approvals will expire prior to an 6 7 improvement in the economy and the financial and banking industries. Therefore, the best longterm solution is to extend the time by which such permits and approvals will expire until the 8 9 marketing and financing conditions improve as to provide an opportunity for such real estate 10 developers to obtain the financing necessary to complete the projects for which the permits and 11 approvals were obtained. 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 45-23 of the General Laws entitled Subdivision of Land" is hereby 13 amended by adding thereto the following section: 14 45-23-63.2. Procedure -- Tolling of expiration periods. - (a) Notwithstanding any other 15 provision set forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval issued 16 pursuant to the local regulations promulgated under this chapter shall be tolled until June 30, 17 2011. 18 (b) Said tolling need not be recorded in the land evidence records to be valid, however, a

notice of the tolling must be posted in both the municipal planning department, the municipal

14	other provision set forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval
15	issued pursuant to the local ordinances promulgated under this chapter shall be tolled until June
16	<u>30, 2011.</u>
17	(b) Said tolling need not be recorded in the land evidence records to be valid, however, a
18	notice of the tolling must be posted in the municipal planning department, the municipal clerk's
19	office, or near the land evidence records.
20	(c) The tolling shall apply only to approvals or permits in effect on November 9, 2009,
21	and those granted between November 9, 2009 and June 30, 2011, and shall not revive expired
22	approvals. For purposes of this section, "tolling" shall mean the suspension or temporary
23	stopping of the running of any applicable periods so that revised expiration dates for all permits

32	set forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval or permit issued
33	pursuant to any state statute or any regulation promulgated thereto pertaining to the development
34	of property shall be tolled until June 30, 2011

16	forth in this chapter, all periods pertaining to the expiration of any approval or permit issued
17	pursuant to any state statute or any regulation promulgated thereto pertaining to the development
18	of property shall be tolled until June 30, 2011.
19	(b) Said tolling need not be recorded in the land evidence records to be valid, however, a
20	notice of the tolling must be posted in the municipal planning department, the municipal clerk's
21	office, or near the land evidence records.
22	(c) The tolling shall apply only to approvals or permits in effect on November 9, 2009,
23	and those granted between November 9, 2009 and June 30, 2011, and shall not revive expired

This act would address expiration periods pertaining to any approval or permit issued
pursuant to any state statute.

This act would take effect upon passage and would apply only to approvals and permits
in effect at the time of passage and would not revive any expired approval or permit.

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
