It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows: 1 SECTION 1. Section 11-5-16 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-5 entitled "Assaults" is 2 hereby amended to read as follows: 3 11-5-16. Assault of health care providers or emergency services medical personnel. 4 (a) Any person who shall knowingly and willfully assault a health care provider and/or 5 emergency medical services personnel while that provider is engaged in providing health care services shall be deemed to have committed a felony, and may be imprisoned no more than three 6 7 (3) years and fined not more than fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500), or both. 8 (b) The following terms, as used in this section, are defined as follows: 9 (1) "Health care provider" has the same meaning as defined in § 5-37.3-3 and includes any 10 personnel directed by them. (2) "Emergency medical services personnel" means anyone who provides emergency 11 12 medical transportation services and anyone directed by them. 13 (3) "Health care services" has the same meaning as defined in § 5-37.3-3 and includes any 14 personnel directed by them. 15

(c) For any healthcare employee, who is the victim of assault or assault and battery in the line of duty shall be given the option of providing either the individual's home address, the address of the health care facility where the assault or assault and battery occurred, the address of a labor organization who is representing the employee, if so requested by the employee, or by requesting a judge to impound the individual's home address. The individual may also have their name and

- 2 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
