RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY - HISTORICAL CEMETERIES

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Sections 23-18-10.1, 23-18-11.2 and 23-18-13 of the General Laws in

Chapter 23-18 entitled "Cemeteries" are hereby amended to read as follows:

3 <u>23-18-10.1. Registering historical cemeteries. --</u> In addition to the records and indexes

4 now required to be maintained by every recorder of deeds in all cities and towns, the recorder of

5 deeds in every city and town shall record with an appropriate symbol maintain a register of all

6 historical cemeteries located within the city or town., and shall register these historical cemeteries

7 on an official tax plat or similar instrument used by that city or town to record all plats or parcels

of land. The symbol shall be established by the Rhode Island cemeteries program. The tax

assessor of each city or town shall note the location of each historical cemetery so registered on

the appropriate tax assessor's map with a symbol consisting of the letters "CEM" inside a

rectangle.

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23-18-11.2. Regulation of excavation -- Removal and transfer of graves and

13 <u>cemeteries -- Penalties. --</u> (a) The city or town council of any municipality may by ordinance

prescribe standards, in addition to those required by section 23-18-10, regulating the excavation,

15 removal, and transfer of any graves, grave sites, and cemeteries in the municipality so as to

provide an accurate record of any activity and to insure that any remains removed are properly re-

interred and the location of the new interment is recorded. In the absence of a local ordinance

18 establishing standards, regulations adopted by the <u>Historic Preservation and Heritage</u>

Commission Legislative Commission on Historical Cemeteries (Chapter 18.3 of this title), after

1	providing an opportunity for interested parties to be heard, shall govern. A report of any grave
2	removal and relocation from one cemetery or burial ground to another shall be filed in the clerk's
3	office for each municipality and shall, to the extent permitted by law, be available for public
4	inspection. In instances where there is a headstone or other burial marker identifying the original
5	grave, the headstone or burial marker shall be erected on the site to which any remains are
6	transferred.
7	(b) To the extent not promulgated pursuant to section 23-3-5.1, the state registrar of vital
8	records shall promulgate regulations to establish a system of record-keeping to allow descendants
9	to locate their ancestors' graves in Rhode Island.
10	(c) Any person convicted of violating this section shall be subject to a fine of not more
11	than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) one thousand dollars (\$100).
12	(d) The provisions of this section shall be considered to be in addition to any other
13	penalties provided for desecration or vandalism to cemeteries.
14	23-18-13. Notification of state archaeologist The state archaeologist shall be notified
15	whenever an ancient burial place contains or is suspected to contain the remains of one or more
16	persons American Indians.
17	SECTION 2. Sections 23-18.3-1, 23-18.3-2, 23-18.3-3 and 23-18.3-4 of the General
18	Laws in Chapter 23-18.3 entitled "Advisory Commission on Historical Cemeteries" are hereby
19	amended to read as follows:
20	23-18.3-1. Establishment Purpose Membership Compensation (a) There is
21	created a permanent advisory commission to study the location, condition, and inventory of
22	historical cemeteries in Rhode Island and to make recommendations to the general assembly
23	relative to historical cemeteries in Rhode Island.
24	(b) The commission shall consist of fourteen (14) seventeen (17) members all of whom
25	shall be citizens and residents of this state. One shall be the director of veterans' cemeteries or his
26	or her designee.
27	(c) One shall be the executive director of the Rhode Island historical preservation and
28	heritage commission or his or her designee.
29	(d) One shall be the director of the Rhode Island Historical Society or his or her
30	designee.

(f) The governor, in consultation with and upon the recommendation of local historical or preservation societies within each county, shall appoint $\frac{10}{10}$ thirteen (13) members of the

the governor. who shall serve for one year.

(e) One shall be a representative of the League of Cities and Towns to be appointed by

2	representatives from Bristol County, two (2) representatives from Newport County, three (3)
3	representatives from Washington County, and four (4) representatives from Providence County.
4	Beginning on September 1, 2009, one representative from Bristol County, one representative
5	from Newport County, one representative from Washington County, and one representatives from
6	Providence County shall be appointed to serve a one year term to expire August 31, 2010, one
7	representative from Kent County, one representative from Washington County, and one
8	representatives from Providence County shall be appointed to serve a two (2) year terms to expire
9	August 31, 2011, and one representative from Bristol County, one representative from Kent
10	Count, one representative from Newport County, one representative from Washington County,
11	and one representative from Providence County shall be appointed to serve three (3) year terms to
12	expire August 31,2012. Thereafter, each county representative shall be appointed for a three (3)
13	year term, county representatives shall serve until their successors are appointed. Vacancies shall
14	be filled by the authority making the original appointment.
15	(i) The members shall annually elect a chairperson <u>a vice chairperson and a secretary.</u>
16	The secretary need not be a member of the commission. of the commission. Any vacancy shall be
17	filled by the authority making the original appointment. Members of the commission shall serve
18	without compensation.
19	23-18.3-2. Quorum Eleven (11) A simple majority members of the commission shall
20	constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business. The speaker of the house shall make
21	available suitable quarters for commission meetings. Meetings may be called upon reasonable
22	notice by the chairperson.
23	23-18.3-3. Rules and regulations The commission shall adopt reasonable rules and
24	regulations in compliance with the open meetings law governing its operations and procedure to
25	earry out the purposes of this chapter. to govern the conduct of its meetings and the
26	accomplishment of its purposes under this chapter.
27	<u>23-18.3-4. Commission report. – Annually, the The</u> -commission shall report its findings
28	and recommendations to the general assembly on or before January 15 of each year to the
29	governor and to the historical Presentation and Heritage Commission.
30	SECTION 3. Chapter 34-11 of the General Laws entitled "Form and Effect of
31	Conveyances" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
32	34-11-1.5. Historical cemeteries. – Every deed presented for recording a transfer in
33	ownership of property that has located on it a historical cemetery registered pursuant to section
34	23-18-10.1 shall have endorsed upon the deed, in capital letters, a notation that a historical

- 1 <u>cemetery</u> is located on the property. Failure to comply with this section shall not effect the
- 2 <u>validity of any deed.</u>
- 3 SECTION 4. Chapter 44-3 of the General Laws entitled "Property Subject to Taxation" is
- 4 hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 5 <u>44-3-63. Historical cemeteries taxation.</u> <u>City and town councils are authorized to</u>
- 6 provide by ordinance an abatement from taxation for any real property on which is located a
- 7 historical cemetery registered pursuant to section 23-18-10.1 and to provide by ordinance for full
- 8 or partial reimbursement of expenses incurred in repairing and maintaining such historical
- 9 <u>cemeteries</u>, including walls or fences surrounding such cemeteries.
- SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon passage.
