It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 27-18 of the General Laws entitled "Accident and Sickness Insurance
- 2 Policies" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 <u>27-18-95. Primary care referrals.</u>
- 4 (a) On or after January 1, 2025, every individual or group health insurance contract, plan,
- 5 or policy that is delivered, issued for delivery, prescribed, or renewed in this state shall not require

6 <u>a patient to obtain a referral for a specialist from their primary care provider (PCP) in order to</u>

- 7 <u>address their health care needs.</u>
- 8 (b) The insurer shall not require a higher or additional copay or coinsurance coverage after
- 9 <u>the application of the deductible for visiting a specialist without a primary care referral.</u>

10 SECTION 2. Chapter 27-19 of the General Laws entitled "Nonprofit Hospital Service

11 Corporations" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

- 12 **<u>27-19-87. Primary care referrals.</u>**
- 13 (a) On or after January 1, 2025, every individual or group health insurance contract, plan,
- 14 or policy that is delivered, issued for delivery, prescribed, or renewed in this state shall not require
- 15 <u>a patient to obtain a referral for a specialist from their primary care provider (PCP) in order to</u>
- 16 <u>address their health care needs.</u>
- 17 (b) The insurer shall not require a higher or additional copay or coinsurance coverage after
- 18 the application of the deductible for visiting a specialist without a primary care referral.

- 13 or policy that is delivered, issued for delivery, prescribed, or renewed in this state shall not require
- 14 <u>a patient to obtain a referral for a specialist from their primary care provider (PCP) in order to</u>
- 15 <u>address their health care needs.</u>
- 16 (b) The insurer shall not require a higher or additional copay or coinsurance coverage after
- 17 the application of the deductible for visiting a specialist without a primary care referral.
- 18 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon passage.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

RELATING TO INSURANCE -- ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS INSURANCE POLICIES

- 1 This act would remove the requirement for a patient to obtain a referral from their primary
- 2 care provider in order to see a specialist, on or after January 1, 2025.
- 3 This act would take effect upon passage.

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
