# AN ACT

### RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT - BLUE ALERT SYSTEM

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

| 1  | SECTION 1. Chapter 42-28 of the General Laws entitled "State Police" is hereby                          |
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| 2  | amended by adding thereto the following section:  |
| 3  | 42-28-3.5. Blue alert - Apprehension of criminals - Public safety (a) The general                       |
| 4  | assembly hereby finds that violence perpetuated upon peace officers in the line of duty is a            |
| 5  | serious threat to public safety. The general assembly also finds that time is of the essence in         |
| 6  | apprehending the individual(s) who perpetrate said violence; and that the implementation of a           |
| 7  | public alert system is necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety.               |
| 8  | (b) The division of state police, in consultation with municipal state and federal agencies             |
| 9  | shall develop a voluntary partnership among law enforcement agencies, media outlets and other           |
| 10 | appropriate entities, including, but not limited to, entities located outside the borders of this state |
| 11 | to issue emergency alerts entitled "Blue Alert." The "Blue Alert" system may be activated, in           |
| 12 | accordance with the provisions contained in this section, when a suspect of a crime involving the       |
| 13 | death or serious injury of a peace officer has not been apprehended, and the superintendent of the      |
| 14 | state police, or his or her designee, has determined that a suspect may be a serious threat to public   |
| 15 | safety. The "Blue Alert" system may also be activated when a peace officer becomes missing              |
| 16 | while in the line of duty under circumstances warranting concern for such peace officer's safety.       |
| 17 | (c) The "Blue Alert" program described herein shall include a pro-active emergency                      |
| 18 | public alert plan as part of the response to the death or serious bodily injury of a peace officer.     |
| 19 | The "Blue Alert" program shall be activated and terminated by the superintendent of the state           |

- 1 police, or his or her designee. The division of the state police shall establish criteria, protocols,
- 2 and procedures necessary for the implementation of this program. Said criteria protocols and
- 3 procedures shall be predicated upon public safety.
- 4 (d) For the purpose of this section "peace officer" means any person certified to exercise
- 5 <u>the powers of arrest.</u>
- 6 (e) In addition to the powers contained herein, the superintendent of the state police, or
- 7 <u>his or her designee has the authority to implement the "Blue Alert" system, absent the death or</u>
- 8 serious bodily injury of a peace officer, if a situation exists which involves a serious threat to
- 9 public safety and public notification is warranted.
- 10 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

# RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT - BLUE ALERT SYSTEM

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This act would direct the division of state police to establish a public alert system to be
utilized when criminal activity results in death or serious injury to a peace officer while in the line
of duty. It would also allow utilization of the system in situations that involve a serious threat to
public safety.
This act would take effect upon passage.

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
