HOUSE RESOLUTION

IN SUPPORT OF ACKNOWLEDGING BLOCK ISLAND'S MANISSEAN TRIBAL NATIVES

1	WHEREAS, The State of Rhode Island has been home to Native Tribes for centuries; and
2	WHEREAS, The first founders to establish a community on Block Island were
3	Manissean tribal Natives, who inhabited the island called "Manisses" for centuries; and
4	WHEREAS, In 1661, Native tribe members that remained on the island numbered
5	between 1,200 and 1,500, but by 1774 that number had been reduced to 51; and
6	WHEREAS, In 1985, an archaeological excavation located a year-round Manissean
7	village site on the island with carbon dated objects establishing its time frame to be 500 B.C.; and
8	WHEREAS, Artifacts found in this area suggested that this highly skilled maritime
9	culture went deep-sea fishing by navigating their dugout canoes through a transient breach way
10	between Great Salt Pond and the ocean. Remains of many sturgeon, a deep-water fish, were
11	found during the excavation along the shore of the pond; and
12	WHEREAS, Additional archaeological sites on the island indicate that the indigenous
13	tribes lived primarily by hunting deer, catching fish and shellfish, growing corn, beans and squash
14	and making trades with Wampum; and
15	WHEREAS, In 1672, Block Island received its Town Charter from the Rhode Island
16	General Assembly, and was incorporated by the Colony of Rhode Island as "New Shoreham,
17	otherwise known as Block Island"; and
18	WHEREAS, The tiny tribal native community has persevered despite wars, invasion,
19	servitude and taxation; and
20	WHEREAS, Through the ensuing centuries, the Manissean Tribe Natives remained a

1	challenged and independent community while still fully participating in the local economy; and
2	WHEREAS, The Manissean natives remain unabashedly proud of their island and their
3	heritage. They strive to strike a balance among preservation of land, cultural awareness and tribal
4	development, and affordable living and economic opportunities in today's economy; and
5	WHEREAS, The Manissean Tribe celebrates the importance and rich heritage of all the
6	ancestors who have come before them to establish native village communities on Block Island;
7	now, therefore be it
8	RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives of the State of Rhode Island hereby
9	supports acknowledging Block Island's Manissean Tribal Natives; and be it further
10	RESOLVED, That this House hereby honors the Manissean Native Ancestors and
11	Descendants. We furthermore commemorate and encourage the preservation of the local
12	indigenous culture and their historical sites; and be it further
13	RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to
14	transmit a duly certified copy of this resolution to Maryann Gobern Mathews, President of the
15	Manissean Tribe of Block Island, for the descendants of the island's original native families.
