RELATING TO ANIMALS AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY -- RHODE ISLAND SPAY AND NEUTER FUND

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 4-9 of the General Laws entitled "Biological Products" is hereby 2 amended by adding thereto the following section:

4-9-16.1. Rhode Island spay and neuter fund. -- (a) There is hereby established a separate fund within the general fund to be called the Rhode Island Spay and Neuter Fund to assist residents of the state in paying all or part of any costs associated with reducing the numbers of homeless animals through spaying and neutering. Said fund shall be administered by the general treasurer in accordance with the same laws and fiscal procedures as the general funds of the state. The fund shall consist of sums collected as a result of the taxpayer check-off as provided for in section 44-30-2.11. The general treasurer is authorized to accept any grant, devise, bequest, donation, gift, or assignment of money, bonds, or other valuable securities for deposit in and credit of the Rhode Island Spay and Neuter Fund. The fund shall be expended only for the purposes stated above at the direction of the director of the department of environmental management and any unexpended balances shall be redeposited in the fund for future use consistent with this section.

(b) There is hereby established an advisory committee to assist the director in establishing procedures for disbursements from the Rhode Island Spay and Neuter Fund.

Members of the advisory committee shall receive no compensation or reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The advisory committee shall consist of the

2	(1) One member from a humane society, animal rescue or sheltering organization;
3	(2) One representative from the an association organized in Rhode Island for animal
4	control officers;
5	(3) One representative from the state veterinary medical association;
6	(4) One representative from the department of environmental management;
7	(5) One member of the general public with an interest in reducing the number of
8	homeless animals.
9	All members of the advisory committee shall be residents of the state. The board
10	members shall serve three (3) year terms; except that three (3) of the members appointed initially
11	shall serve a term of two (2) years. All members shall have an active interest in reducing the
12	number of homeless pets and educating the community regarding the benefits of pet population
13	control in the state.
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 44-30.2 of the General Laws entitled "Reciprocity Agreements -
15	Setoff of Refund of Personal Income Tax" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following
16	section:
17	44-30.2-11. Refund deduction for contribution to the Rhode Island spay and neuter
18	fund (a) There shall be provided as a deduction from any refund from the Rhode Island
19	personal income tax otherwise due to a taxpayer for a taxable year a contribution to the Rhode
20	Island Spay and Neuter Fund established in section 49-16.1. The provision for the contribution
21	shall appear on the state personal income tax return as follows:
22	Rhode Island Spay and Neuter Fund. Check if you wish to contribute [] \$1, [] \$5, [
23	\$10, or [] \$ (write in amount of your tax REFUND for this program).
24	(b) The tax administrator shall deposit all contributions made to the Rhode Island Spay
25	and Neuter Fund as general revenues.
26	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
