It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 28-7-45 of the General Laws in Chapter 28-7 entitled "Labor

Relations Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:

28-7-45. Employees exempt from chapter. -- (a) The provisions of this chapter shall not

4 apply: (1) to the employees of any employer who concedes to and agrees with the board that the

employees are subject to and protected by the provisions of the National Labor Management

6 Relations Act, 29 U.S.C. section 141 et seq., or the federal Railway Labor Act, 45 U.S.C. section

7 151 et seq.; (2) except as provided in Chapter 11 of title 36 as to employees of the state; (3)

8 except as provided in chapter 9.4 of this title as to employees of any political or civil subdivision

9 or other agency thereof; (4) except "firefighters" as defined in chapter 9.1 of this title and "police

officers" as defined in chapter 9.2 of this title; or (5) except "school teachers" as defined in

chapter 9.3 of this title; provided, that in the case of firefighters, police officers, school teachers

12 <u>as defined in chapter 9.3 of this title</u>, and health care provider employees, including those of

13 hospitals, nursing homes, ambulatory care centers, and orphanages, the provisions of this chapter

shall apply, but nothing contained in this chapter shall be deemed in any manner to grant to any

firefighters, police officers, school teachers as defined in chapter 9.3 of this title, or health care

16 provider employees, including those of hospitals, nursing homes, ambulatory care centers, and

orphanages, the right to engage in any strike. Any strike by any firefighters, police officers,

school teachers as defined in chapter 9.3 of this title, or health care provider employees, including

those of hospitals, nursing homes, ambulatory care centers, and orphanages, shall be illegal.

1 (b) When an impasse is reached by an employer and a union representing health care 2 provider employees, including those of hospitals, nursing homes, ambulatory care centers, and 3 orphanages, the mediation services of the department of labor and training shall be utilized for 4 mediation and fact finding. If the issues remain unresolved, then the parties shall proceed to 5 arbitration in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
