It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 35-3-24.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 35-3 entitled "State 2

Budget" is hereby amended to read as follows:

35-3-24.1. Program performance measurement. -- (a) Beginning with the fiscal year 3

4 ending June 30, 1997, the governor shall submit, as part of each budget submitted to the general

assembly pursuant to section 35-3-7, performance objectives for each program in the budget for

the ensuing fiscal year, estimated performance data for the fiscal year in which the budget is 6

submitted, and actual performance data for the preceding two (2) completed fiscal years.

Performance data shall include efforts at achieving equal opportunity hiring goals as defined in 8

the department's annual affirmative action plan. The governor shall, in addition, recommend

appropriate standards against which to measure program performance. Performance in prior years

may be used as a standard where appropriate. These performance standards shall be stated in

terms of results obtained.

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13 (b) In years where performance standards were not achieved in the prior fiscal year, the

14 department or agency shall outline specific steps to be taken to meet the performance standards in

15 the next fiscal year. These steps shall be submitted with the governor's budget.

16 (b)(c) The governor may submit, in lieu of any part of the information required to be

17 submitted pursuant to subsection (a), an explanation of why the information cannot, as a practical

18 matter be submitted.

1	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
