It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 42 of the General Laws entitled "STATE AFFAIRS AND
2	GOVERNMENT" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	CHAPTER 154
4	THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER PRIVACY ACT
5	42-154-1. Short title This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Social
6	Security Number Privacy Act."
7	<u>42-154-2. Social security number privacy recognition. – (a) It shall be unlawful for</u>
8	any state or local government agency to deny to any individual any right, benefit, or privilege
9	provided by law because of such individual's refusal to disclose his or her social security number.
10	(b) The prohibition contained in subsection (a) shall not apply with respect to:
11	(1) Any disclosure which is required by federal or state statute at any time;
12	(2) Any disclosure of a social security number to any state or local agency maintaining a
13	system of records in existence and operating before January 1, 1975, if such disclosure was
14	required under statute or regulation adopted prior to such date to verify the identity of an
15	individual;
16	(3) Any disclosure of a social security number to any state or local agency maintaining a
17	system of records if such disclosure: (i) Is authorized pursuant to federal statute for the lawful
18	administration of any tax law, general public assistance law, driver's license law, motor vehicle

- 1 registration law; and (ii) Is made pursuant to a state or local agency practice lawfully in existence
- 2 <u>before May 1, 2011; or</u>
- 3 (4) Any disclosure of a social security number to any state or local agency directly
- 4 <u>authorized by state statute.</u>
- 5 42-154-3. Reason for required disclosure requirement. - Any state or local 6 government agency which requests an individual to disclose his or her social security number 7 shall inform that individual whether that disclosure is mandatory or voluntary, by what statutory 8 or other authority it is solicited, and what uses will be made of it. 42-154-4. Remedies. – In any civil action alleging a violation of this chapter, the court 9 10 may award injunctive relief against any agency that commits or proposes to commit a violation of 11 this chapter, along with reasonable attorneys' fees and costs to a prevailing plaintiff. 12 42-154-5. Exemptions. – For the purposes of this chapter, "state or local government 13 agency" does not include the legislature or the courts as defined by subsection 42-35-1(a). 14 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
