It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 9-5-35 of the General Laws in Chapter 9-5 entitled "Writs,

2 Summons and Process" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 <u>9-5-35. Service of court papers at work. – (a)</u> No employer within this state is

4 permitted to refuse or obstruct the service of any court process upon an employee at the place of

5 employment and such service shall not be grounds for dismissal of the employee. The employer

- 6 may designate an area where the service may be effected.
- 7 (b) Any employer and/or agent of such employer, violating the provisions of this section
- 8 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to imprisonment for a term not exceeding
- 9 <u>one year and/or fined an amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500).</u>
- 10 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
