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### JOINT RESOLUTION

CREATING A SPECIAL JOINT COMMISSION TO STUDY THE INTEGRATION OF THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND PRIMARY CARE DELIVERY SYSTEM IN RHODE ISLAND TOWARD THE CREATION OF A PRIMARY CARE TRUST

1 WHEREAS, It is the long-standing policy of the State of Rhode Island to take cognizance 2 of the interests of life and health among the peoples of the state, to make investigations into the 3 causes of diseases, the prevalence of epidemics and endemics among the people, the sources of 4 mortality, the effect of localities, employments, and all other conditions and circumstances on the 5 public health, do all in its power to ascertain the causes and the best means for the prevention and control of diseases or conditions detrimental to the public health, and adopt proper and expedient 6 7 measures to prevent and control diseases and conditions detrimental to the public health in the 8 state; and 9 WHEREAS, Population health outcomes in Rhode Island, as in the nation as a whole, are 10 persistently and significantly worse for factors such as infant mortality, prevalence of chronic 11 disease, serious mental illness, and life expectancy than in other developed countries with similar 12 socio-economic resources; and 13 WHEREAS, The federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration 14 (SAMHSA) and the Health Research and Services Administration (HRSA) established the Center for Integrated Health Solutions (CIHS) to promote the development of integrated primary and 15 behavioral health services to better address the needs of individuals with mental health and 16 17 substance use conditions; and 18 WHEREAS, Despite these inferior health outcomes, the global cost of medical and other

health care services in the State of Rhode Island, as in the nation as a whole, is among the highest

in the world and imposes significant burdens on business, government, families, and individuals; and

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WHEREAS, In Rhode Island, as in the nation as a whole, global medical and other health care costs are projected to continue rising faster than the gross national product, than family income, and than the rate of inflation, and unless effectively addressed, will soon become unsustainable, threatening the economy, public budgets, and Rhode Islanders' access to affordable care; and

WHEREAS, There is a large body of data and other research that demonstrate the potential for improving the public health and population-based outcomes through improving the delivery of and access to primary care that is community-based and patient-centered; and

WHEREAS, Improving population-based health outcomes and integrating behavioral health and primary care will result in significant savings by averting the costs incurred by treating chronic diseases, premature death, and diminished productivity at work and school; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That a special joint commission be and the same hereby is created and shall consist of twenty-one (21) members: one of whom shall be a member of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate President; one of whom shall be a member of the House, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; one of whom shall be the Director of the Department of Health or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the Director of the Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities, and Hospitals or his/her designee; one of whom shall be a representative of the Rhode Island AFL-CIO; one of whom shall be a representative of the UNAP; one of whom shall be the President of the Hospital Association of Rhode Island or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the President of the Rhode Island Academy of Family Physicians or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the President of the American Academy of Pediatrics Rhode Island Chapter or his/her designee; one of whom shall be President of the Rhode Island Academy of Physician Assistants or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the Executive Director of the Rhode Island Medical Society or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the President of the Rhode Island Psychological Association or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the Executive Director of the Rhode Island Nurses Association or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the President of the National Association of Social Workers Rhode Island Chapter or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the President/CEO of the Rhode Island Health Centers Association or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the President/CEO of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Rhode Island or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the Associate Dean of Medicine for Brown University School of Public Health or his/her designee; one of whom shall be

2	CEO of Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island or his/her designee; one of whom shall be the
3	President of the Rhode Island Council of Community Mental Health Organizations or his/her
4	designee; and one of whom shall be the Executive Director of the Drug and Alcohol Treatment
5	Association of Rhode Island or his/her designee.
6	In lieu of any appointment of a member of the legislature to this commission, the
7	appointing authority may appoint a member of the general public to serve in lieu of a legislator,
8	provided that the majority leader or minority leader of the political party which is entitled to the
9	appointment consents to the appointment of the member of the general public and the public
10	member is a resident of the State of Rhode Island.
11	The purpose of said commission shall be to make a comprehensive study of the current
12	status of primary care and behavioral health in Rhode Island; of the available research, data and
13	analyses of the impact of primary care and behavioral health service availability and delivery
14	system architecture on population outcomes; and of the advisability of creating a Primary Care
15	Trust or other mechanism to fund and otherwise support a comprehensive integrated primary care
16	and behavioral health system for all Rhode Islanders. In studying this issue, the commission is
17	encouraged to:
18	(1) Examine trends, current policies, and data pertaining to Rhode Island behavioral
19	health and primary care utilization trends;
20	(2) Identify policy restrictions which currently prevent Rhode Island from integrating
21	primary care and behavioral health systems;
22	(3) Identify and seek ways to remedy gaps in the system, specifically in the area of
23	linkages and connections among providers and agencies in delivering comprehensive,
24	community-based healthcare services;
25	(4) Examine the role of multi payers within the market and potential innovative delivery
26	systems and payment reforms.
27	(5) Examine potential funding and grant opportunities to advance the recommendations
28	of the commission.
29	Forthwith upon passage of the resolution, the members of the commission shall meet at
30	the call of the Speaker of the House and President of the Senate and organize and shall select,
31	from among the legislators, co-chairpersons.
32	Vacancies in said commission shall be filled in the manner as the original appointment.
33	The membership of said commission shall receive no compensation for their services.
34	All departments and agencies of the state shall furnish such advice and information,

- 6 Governor, the Secretary of the Executive Office of Health and Human Services, and the General
- Assembly no later than January 28, 2014, and said commission shall expire on June 13, 2016.

5	on population outcomes; and of the advisability of creating a Primary Care Trust or other
6	mechanism to fund and otherwise support a comprehensive integrated primary care and
7	behavioral health system for all Rhode Islanders, and who would report back to the general
8	assembly no later than January 28, 2014, and whose life would expire on June 13, 2016.

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
