SENATE RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING MAY OF 2023, TO BE "EHLERS-DANLOS SYNDROMES AND HYPERMOBILITY SPECTRUM DISORDERS AWARENESS MONTH" IN THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND

1 WHEREAS, Ehlers-Danlos syndromes (EDS) are a group of genetic connective tissue 2 disorders caused by different underlying abnormalities in collagen that together affect 1 in 5,000 3 people of every age and race; and 4 WHEREAS, Each type of EDS has its own set of symptoms, but some features seen across all types of EDS include joint hypermobility and dislocation, fragile, hyperextensible skin 5 6 that bruises and scars easily, and tissue fragility; and 7 WHEREAS, EDS is often inherited and can affect multiple generations within a family; 8 and 9 WHEREAS, There is neither routine screening nor a cure for EDS, and treatment focuses 10 on managing symptoms and preventing dangerous complications; and 11 WHEREAS, Severe cases can be associated with unpredictable tearing of blood vessels 12 and organs, leading to internal bleeding and other potentially life-threatening complications; and WHEREAS, Hypermobility Spectrum Disorders (HSD) are connective tissue disorders 13 that cause joint hypermobility, instability, injury, pain, fatigue, headaches, GI problems, and 14 15 autonomic dysfunction; and 16 WHEREAS, HSD is diagnosed when the musculoskeletal complications of joint hypermobility and joint stability, such as joint movement beyond the normal range, joint pain, 17

and dislocations, arise in a person who does not have the defining features of an underlying

syndrome such as EDS or other heritable disorders of connective tissue; and

| 1 | WHEREAS, In addition, several related disorders are observed in a number of people of |
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| 2 | EDS and with HSD, which can add complexity to the presentation of their condition and its |
| 3 | management; and |
| 4 | WHEREAS, There is no cure for any type of EDS or HDS and conditions are managed |
| 5 | by addressing a person's individual symptoms; and |
| 6 | WHEREAS, EDS and HSD can cause a variety of symptoms in many different areas of |
| 7 | the body, so people with these conditions often require multiple providers in different specialties |
| 8 | to manage their care; and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, Access to professionals who are knowledgeable about EDS and HSD is |
| 10 | limited not only in Rhode Island, but across the world; and |
| 1 | WHEREAS, Individuals with EDS and HSD can sometimes remain undiagnosed for |
| 12 | decades, while their symptoms progress and become more difficult to treat; and |
| 13 | WHEREAS, Improved knowledge and recognition of EDS and HSD will lead to earlier |
| 14 | detection and medical management, thereby reducing the burden of disease and its negative |
| 15 | impact on families; and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, Continued research is needed to better understand EDS and HSD and |
| 17 | encouraging further studies can lead to breakthroughs in genetic testing, treatments, and other |
| 18 | medical interventions, generating growth in the knowledge base and bringing hope for a cure; |
| 19 | now, therefore be it |
| 20 | RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island hereby proclaims May of |
| 21 | 2023, to be "Ehlers-Danlos Syndromes and Hypermobility Spectrum Disorders Awareness |
| 22 | Month" in the State of Rhode Island; and be it further |
| 23 | RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to |
| 24 | transmit a duly certified copy of this resolution to Ms. Susan Hawkins, Chair, The Ehlers-Danlos |
