It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 9-5-35 of the General Laws in Chapter 9-5 entitled "Writs,

Summons and Process" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 <u>9-5-35. Service of court papers at work.</u> – (a) No employer within this state is

4 permitted to refuse or obstruct the service of any court process upon an employee at the place of

employment and such service shall not be grounds for dismissal of the employee. The employer

6 may designate an area where the service may be effected.

7 (b) Any employer and/or agent of such employer, violating the provisions of this section

shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to imprisonment for a term not exceeding

9 one year and/or fined an amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500).

10 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
