### RELATING TO PROPERTY - MECHANICS' LIENS

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 34-28-4.1 and 34-38-9 of the General Laws in Chapter 34-28
entitled "Mechanics' Liens" are hereby amended to read as follows:

3 34-28-4.1. Contractors. -- Except for emergency work, no No person contracting 4 directly with either the owner of the land, lessee, or tenant of the land, or owner of less than the 5 fee simple, other than material suppliers, as those terms are referred to in sections 1, 2 and 3 [sections 34-28-1, 34-28-2, 34-28-3]of this chapter, shall be entitled to claim a lien under this 6 7 chapter unless that person shall have given the following notice to the owner, lessee or tenant, or owner of less than the fee simple in writing, by certified mail, return receipt requested, within at 8 9 least ten (10) business days of prior to commencing work or delivery of materials for 10 construction, erection, alteration or repair as set forth in this chapter. The failure of such person 11 contracting directly to give such notice shall not affect the right of any other person performing 12 work or furnishing materials of claiming a lien pursuant to this chapter, provided that the 13 procedures set forth in this chapter are followed. However, such person failing to file such notice 14 shall indemnify and hold harmless any owner, lessee or tenant, or owner of less than the fee 15 simple from any payment or costs incurred on account of any liens claims by those not in privity 16 with them, unless such owner, lessee or tenant, or owner of less that the fee simple shall not have 17 paid such person.

#### 18 NOTICE OF POSSIBLE MECHANIC'S LIEN

19 To: Insert name of owner, lessee or tenant, or owner of less than the fee simple.

1 The undersigned is about to perform work and/or furnish materials for the construction, 2 erection, alterations or repair upon the land at (INSERT ADDRESS) under contract with you. 3 This is a notice that the undersigned and any other persons who provide labor and materials for 4 the improvement under contract with the undersigned may file a mechanic's lien upon the land in 5 the event of nonpayment to them. It is your responsibility to assure yourself that those other 6 persons under contract with the undersigned receive payment for their work performed and 7 materials furnished for the construction, erection, alteration or repair upon the land. 8 <u>34-28-9. Effective period of notice. – (a)</u> A notice of lien recorded in the land evidence 9 records pursuant to section 34-28-4 shall be effective for two hundred (200) days prior to the date 10 of filing. A notice of lien shall be effective as to any retainage earned but not paid, for work 11 furnished pursuant to section 34-28-1 et. seq., and said notice of lien shall be effective from 12 commencement of said work. Retainage is a percentage of the total contract amount that is 13 withheld by the owner from the general contractor and by the general contractor from the 14 subcontractor until the entire job is completed and the project is accepted by the owner and by the 15 general contractor, at which time the retainage due is paid. (b) The limitation period to file a notice of intention to claim retainage shall be within 16

17 two (2) years after the doing of such work or the furnishing of such materials.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

## RELATING TO PROPERTY - MECHANICS' LIENS

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This act would require contractors to give notice to the owner, lessee or tenant, or owner of less than the fee simple in writing, by certified mail return receipt requested, at least ten (10) business days prior to commencing work or delivery of materials for construction, erection, alteration or repair, to claim a mechanics' lien. The act would also provide an exception to the notice requirements herein for emergency work, and set forth a time period for filing a notice of intention to claim retainage.

7 This act would take effect upon passage.

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
