It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. The title of Chapter 16-21.7 of the General Laws entitled "The Nathan Bruno
2	and Jason Flatt Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:

5	<u>CHAPTER 16-21.7</u>
6	THE NATHAN BRUNO, JASON FLATT, AND ALICIA BIROS BEREAVEMENT ACT
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 16-21.7 of the General Laws entitled "The Nathan Bruno and Jason
8	Flatt Act" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
9	16-21.7-5. Flexible schools schedule to be implemented upon death of student or
10	educator.
11	In the event of a tragic death of an educator or a student within a local educational agency
12	(LEA), the LEA shall be given up to five (5) days after the death to implement a flexible school
13	schedule for teachers and students. Within that time, an LEA crisis team shall determine the proper
14	need of those days, which may include, but is not limited to, attending funerals, training staff to
15	support grieving students, days of mourning, and staff working directly with the students that have
16	been affected by the death. Schools shall not be required to make up the grief days at the end of the
17	school year.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION -- THE NATHAN BRUNO AND JASON FLATT ACT

This act would provide that in the event of the death of an educator or a student, a local
educational agency would be given up to five (5) days after the death to implement a flexible school
schedule for teachers and students. This act would also amend the title of chapter 16-21.7 to "The
Nathan Bruno, Jason Flatt, and Alicia Biros Bereavement Act."
This act would take effect upon passage.
