It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Title 11 of the General Laws entitled "CRIMINAL OFFENSES" is hereby
2	amended by adding thereto the following chapter:
3	CHAPTER 70
4	FALSE REPRESENTATION OF MILITARY STATUS
5	11-70-1. False representation of military status prohibited – Stolen valor.
6	(a) A person commits the crime of stolen valor if he or she knowingly, with the intent to
7	obtain money or property:
8	(1) Fraudulently represents himself or herself to be an active member or veteran of the
9	United States Navy, Army, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard, including armed forces reserves
0	and National Guard through the unauthorized manufacture, sale, or use of military regalia or gear,
1	including the wearing of military uniforms, or the use of falsified military identification, and
2	obtains money or property through such fraudulent representation; or
3	(2) Fraudulently represents himself or herself to be a recipient of the Congressional Medal
4	of Honor, Distinguished Service Cross, Navy Cross, Air Force Cross, Silver Star, Purple Heart,
5	Combat Infantryman Badge, Combat Action Badge, Combat Medical Badge, Combat Action
6	Ribbon, or Air Force Combat Action Medal, and obtains money or property through such
7	fraudulent representation.
8	(b) A person who commits the crime of stolen valor is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall

- 1 <u>be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of one thousand dollars</u>
- 2 (\$1,000), or both.
- 3 (c) Any monies collected pursuant to this chapter shall be forwarded to the office of the
- 4 adjutant general to be allocated to the Rhode Island military family relief fund established pursuant
- 5 <u>to § 30-3-41.</u>
- 6 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- FALSE REPRESENTATION OF MILITARY **STATUS**

1 This act would create a new crime, referred to as stolen valor, which would be committed 2 by any person who knowingly, with the intent to obtain money or property, fraudulently represents 3 himself or herself as an active or inactive member of the military or armed forces. The crime would 4 be a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment of not more than one year, a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or both. 5 This act would take effect upon passage. 6 LC004582/SUB A
