## SENATE RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING FEBRUARY 15, 2024, AS "THE 1ST RHODE ISLAND REGIMENT/BLACK REGIMENT RECOGNITION DAY" TO COMMEMORATE THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF BLACK SOLDIERS DURING THE AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR

1 WHEREAS, It is important to recognize the role of Black people in every aspect of 2 American history since the colonial days; and 3 WHEREAS, There is little public awareness of the contributions of Black people during 4 the American Revolutionary War; and 5 WHEREAS, Despite the horrors of enslavement suffered by Black people in America, some fought to gain their freedom, as well as American Independence, by becoming members of 6 7 the 1st Rhode Island Regiment during the American Revolutionary War; and 8 WHEREAS, The 1st Rhode Island Regiment was an integrated unit composed of Black, 9 White and Indigenous soldiers, who served together from 1778 through the end of the war in 10 1783; and WHEREAS, In August of 1778, the First Rhode Island Regiment stood bravely on the 11 12 right flank of the Continental Army at Portsmouth, Rhode Island, and drove back three Hessian 13 charges and held the line against the British forces to "distinguish itself with deeds of great 14 valor"; and 15 WHEREAS, The Newport County NAACP, the Newport Middle Passage Port Marker Project, the Bristol Middle Passage Port Marker Project, the Rhode Island Slave History 16 17 Medallions Project, the Battle of Rhode Island Association, the Portsmouth Historical Society and 18 other historical organizations have been working to educate the public about enslaved people in 19 Rhode Island and their contribution to the establishment of America during the colonial period;

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is authorized and directed to transmit duly certified copies of this resolution to the Honorable Joseph Biden, President of the United States, the Rhode Island Congressional Delegation, the Honorable Daniel McKee, Governor of the State of Rhode Island, the Newport County NAACP, the Newport Middle Passage Port Marker Project, the Bristol Middle Passage Port Marker Project, the Rhode Island Slave History Medallions organization, the Battle of Rhode Island Association, and the Portsmouth Historical Society.
