RELATING TO PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES - STATE EMPLOYEE WELLNESS PROGRAM

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 36-12 of the General Laws entitled "Insurance Benefits" is hereby
- 2 amended by adding thereto the following section:
- 3 <u>36-12-16. Comprehensive state employees wellness program. -- (a) Legislative</u>
- 4 <u>findings The general assembly hereby finds that:</u>
- 5 (1) Many states have moved forward to implement high quality wellness programs for

6 their employees similar to those being effectively utilized in the private sector; and

- 7 (2) That such programs provide education and valuable information for employees and
- 8 their families on health issues, disease prevention, exercise, eating habits, and healthy lifestyles,
- 9 that promote a healthy workforce; and

10 (3) That these programs have demonstrated significant cost savings, enhanced employee

- 11 productivity, and reduced future expenses for health care services; and
- 12 (4) That such a program could be designed to improve the quality of care and cost-

13 effectiveness of existing programs for Rhode Island state employees by utilizing the integration

- 14 of best practices from both conventional and complementary alternative medicine providers.
- 15 (b) The Rhode Island department of administration, in consultation with the Rhode Island
- 16 department of health and other appropriate agencies, shall establish a comprehensive wellness
- 17 program for state employees that includes, but is not limited to, a focus on smoking cessation,
- 18 disease prevention, reduction of chronic pain, and weight management. In developing the

- 1 comprehensive wellness program, the department shall consider the integration of both
- 2 <u>conventional and complementary alternative medicines and treatments.</u>
- 3 (c) Beginning on March 1, 2011, the department of administration shall annually provide
- 4 a report to the governor, the president of the senate, and the speaker of the house of
- 5 representatives regarding the effectiveness of the wellness program and the resultant cost savings.
- 6 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

RELATING TO PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES - STATE EMPLOYEE WELLNESS PROGRAM

1 This act would establish a comprehensive state employees wellness program to promote 2 the improved health and wellness of state employees. It would require the state department of 3 administration to annually present a program progress report and cost savings to the governor, the 4 president of the senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives. 5 This act would take effect upon passage.

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
