AN ACT

RELATING TO FISH AND WILDLIFE -- LICENSING, MANAGEMENT, AND AQUACULTURE

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 20-2-44 of the General Laws in Chapter 20-2 entitled "Licensing" is

hereby amended to read as follows:

20-2-44. Shellfish transplant program. -- In addition to any appropriation made

4 pursuant to section 20-2-28.2, the general assembly shall appropriate from the general fund to the

5 division of marine fisheries fish and wildlife, the amount it deems necessary for the purpose of

maintaining a shellfish transplant program for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, and

thereafter, the division of marine fisheries fish and wildlife shall develop a sustainable shellfish

management plan.

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9 SECTION 2. Section 20-3-1 of the General Laws in Chapter 20-3 entitled "Marine

10 Fisheries Council" is hereby amended to read as follows:

20-3-1. Council created -- Membership -- Compensation. -- There is hereby created a

marine fisheries council. The council shall be composed of the director of the department of

environmental management or the director's designee, who shall serve as chairperson and eight

14 (8) private citizen members. The private citizen members shall be chosen from among those with

skill, knowledge, and experience in the commercial fishing industry, the sport fishing industry,

and in the conservation and management of fisheries resources and shall be appointed by the

governor with the advice and consent of the senate. Three (3) of the private citizen members shall

be representatives of the commercial fishing industry; three (3) shall be representatives of the

sport fishing industry; and the remaining two (2) shall have skill, knowledge, and experience in the conservation and management of fisheries resources and/or marine biology. The chairperson of the coastal resources management council and the chiefs of the divisions of enforcement and fish and wildlife marine fisheries in the department of environmental management shall serve in an advisory capacity to the council. Members of the council shall serve for a term of four (4) years and may not succeed themselves more than once after January 1, 2002. Initial appointments to the council shall be appointed as follows: three (3) members for a term of two (2) years, three (3) members for a term of three (3) years, and two (2) members for a term of four (4) years. All members of the council shall serve without compensation and shall be reimbursed for their necessary expenses incurred in travel and in the performance of their duties.

SECTION 3. Sections 20-9-1, 20-9-2 and 20-9-3 of the General Laws in Chapter 20-9 entitled "Cooperation in Federal Projects" are hereby amended to read as follows:

20-9-1. Assent to wildlife restoration projects. -- The state of Rhode Island assents to the provisions of the act of congress entitled "An Act to Provide that the United States Shall Aid the States in Wildlife Restoration Projects, and for Other Purposes", 16 U.S.C. section 669 et seq., and the director of environmental management is authorized, empowered, and directed to perform those acts that may be necessary to the conduct and establishment of cooperative wildlife restoration projects, as defined in that act of congress, in compliance with that act and with rules and regulations promulgated by the secretary of the interior under that act; and no funds accruing to the state of Rhode Island from license fees or interest from license fee accounts paid by hunters shall be diverted for any other purpose than the administration of the division of fish and wildlife division of forestry, inland fisheries and wildlife management of the department of environmental management.

20-9-2. Disbursements for restoration projects. -- The state controller is authorized and directed to draw orders upon the general treasurer for the payment of any sums as may be required for the purposes of section 20-9-1, upon receipt by the controller of proper vouchers duly authenticated and approved by the chief of the division of **fish forestry**, inland fisheries and wildlife **management** and by the director of environmental management.

20-9-3. Assent to fish restoration and management projects. -- The state of Rhode Island assents to the provisions of the act of congress, entitled "An Act to Provide that the United States Shall Aid the States in Fish Restoration and Management Projects, and for Other Purposes", 16 U.S.C. section 777 et seq., and the division of fish and wildlife divisions of forestry, inland fisheries and wildlife management and marine fisheries, with the approval of the director of environmental management, is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to perform

any acts as may be necessary to the conduct and establishment of fish restoration and management projects, as defined in that act of congress, in compliance with that act and with rules and regulations promulgated by the secretary of the interior under that act, and no funds accruing to the state from license fees or interest from license fee accounts paid by fishers shall be diverted for any other purpose than the administration of the division of fish and wildlife divisions of forestry, inland fisheries and wildlife management and marine fisheries of the department of environmental management.

8 SECTION 4. Section 20-10-1.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 20-10 entitled 9 "Aquaculture" is hereby amended to read as follows:

20-10-1.1. Creation of the Biosecurity Board. — There shall be a biosecurity board within the coastal resources management council, (hereinafter referred to as "CRMC"), which shall meet, at minimum, on a quarterly basis and shall be composed of seven (7) members to be designated by the executive director of the CRMC, or his or her designee, with council approval. The council shall select a chair from among the board members, one of whom shall be the executive director of the CRMC or his or her designee, one of whom shall be the state veterinarian or an individual certified in veterinary medicine, with a specialty in aquatic diseases, or by the American Fisheries Society, one of whom shall be a certified medical doctor or a person with a Ph.D. in public health, one of whom shall be a representative of the division of fish and wildlife marine fisheries, one of whom shall be a representative of the marine fisheries council, one of whom shall be a representative industry and one of whom shall be a faculty member of the University of Rhode Island, Department of Fisheries, Animals and Veterinary Science.

SECTION 5. Section 210-3.1 of the General Laws in Chapter 210 entitled "State Forests and Forestry Projects" is hereby amended to read as follows:

2-10-3.1. Assessment of fees for forestry services. -- The director of the department of environmental management shall promulgate regulations for the purposes of assessing fees for services provided by the division of forest environment forestry, inland fisheries and wildlife management, as outlined in chapters 15 and 19 of this title, as well as for services provided by the division of forest environment forestry, inland fisheries and wildlife management for the protection, enhancement, and management of this state's forest resources and these funds shall be deposited within the state forestry fund as provided for in section 2-10-3.

SECTION 6. Sections 42-17.1-3 and 42-17.1-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-17.1 entitled "Department of Environmental Management" are hereby amended to read as follows:

42-17.1-3. Construction of references. -- (a) Whenever in any general or public law the

- words "department of agriculture and conservation," "bureau of markets," "division of conservation," "division of entomology and plant industry," "division of forests," "division of fish and game," "division of fish and wildlife," "division of forest environment," "division of parks and recreation," "division of harbors and rivers," "division of boating safety," "division of enforcement," "division of coastal resources," or "department of natural resources" shall appear,
- (b) Provided, further, that whenever in chapters 3-6, 7, 9, 11, 13, 18 and 19 of title 4 entitled "Animals and Animal Husbandry" the words "director of health" or "department of health" shall appear, they shall be deemed to refer to and to mean the "director of environmental"

management" and "department of environmental management" respectively.

they shall be deemed to refer to and to mean the "department of environmental management."

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- (c) Provided, further, that whenever in any general or public law the words "department of the environment" shall appear, the same shall be deemed to refer to and mean the "department of environmental management" or where applicable the "director of the department of environmental management."
- (d) Provided, further, that whenever in any general law or public law the words "conservation officer" shall appear, they shall be deemed to refer to and to mean "environmental police officer."
- 18 <u>42-17.1-4. Divisions within department. --</u> Within the department of environmental management there are established the following divisions:
 - (1) A division of parks and recreation which shall carry out those functions of the department relating to the operation and maintenance of parks and recreation areas and the establishment and maintenance of such additional recreation areas as may from time to time be acquired and such other functions and duties as may from time to time be assigned by the director;
 - (2) A division of fish and wildlife marine fisheries which shall carry out those functions of the department relating to the administration management, and conservation, of hunting, fishing, all marine and invertebrates, including finfish, and crustacean, and shell fisheries; the preservation of wetlands, marsh lands, and wildlife and such other functions and duties as may from time to time be assigned by the director;
- 30 (3) A division of agriculture which shall carry out those functions of the department 31 relating to agriculture, entomology and plant industry and such other functions and duties as may 32 from time to time be assigned by the director;
- 33 (4) A division of coastal resources which shall carry out those functions of the 34 department relating to harbors and harbor lines, pilotage, flood control, shore development,

construction of port facilities, and the registration of boats and such other functions and duties as may from time to time be assigned by the director, except that the division shall not be responsible for the functions of inspection of dams and reservoirs, approving plans for construction or improvement of dams, reservoirs and other structures in non-tidal waters, and the operation of stream-gauging stations in cooperation with the United States Geological Survey, and provided further that the division and its staff shall be responsible through the director of environmental management, to the coastal resources management council, and the chief and the staff of the division shall serve as staff to the council;

- (5) A division of planning and development which shall carry out those functions of the department relating to planning, programming, acquisition of land, engineering studies and such other studies as the director may direct, and which shall work with the board of governors for higher education and the board of regents for elementary and secondary education, with educational institutions at all levels and with the public in the dissemination of information and education relating to natural resources and shall perform the publication and public relations functions of the department, the functions of inspection of dams and reservoirs, approving plans for construction or improvement of dams, reservoirs, and other structures in non-tidal waters, and the operation of stream-gauging stations in cooperation with the United States Geological Survey;
- (6) A division of enforcement which shall enforce all of the laws and regulations of the department and the coastal resources management council, which shall cooperate with the other enforcement agencies of the state and its municipalities, and which shall administer all of the policing, enforcing, licensing, registration, and inspection functions of the department and such other functions and duties as may from time to time be assigned by the director;
- (7) A division of forest environment forestry, inland fisheries and wildlife management which shall carry out those functions of the department relating to the administration, management and conservation of forests, wildlife and inland fisheries; developing programs for sustainable resources of forests and natural areas, including programs for utilization, conservation, forest fire protection, and management, hunting, fishing and the preservation and improvements of these areas natural areas and habitats to include wetlands and marsh lands; assisting other agencies and local governments in urban programs relating to trees, forests, green belts, and environment and such other functions and duties as may from time to time be assigned by the director;
- (8) (i) A division of boating safety which shall carry out those functions of the department relating to the development and administration of a coordinated safe boating program in accordance with the Model Safe Boating Act of 1971 as approved by the National Association

1	of State Boating Law Administrators;
2	(ii) Administration of the division of boating safety shall be the responsibility of the state
3	boating law administrator whose duties shall include:
4	(A) The enforcement of all laws relating to the act;
5	(B) The powers vested in the state boating law administrator and boating safety
6	enforcement officer shall include the enforcement of laws, rules and regulations relating to
7	"Regulation of Boats," title 46, chapter 22 and shall also include the power to:
8	(I) Execute all warrants and search warrants for the violation of laws, rules and
9	regulations relating to the act.
10	(II) Serve subpoenas issued for the trial of all offenses hereunder.
11	(III) To carry firearms or other weapons, concealed or otherwise, in the course of and ir
12	performance of their duties under this chapter.
13	(IV) To arrest without warrant and on view any person found violating any law, rule, or
14	regulation relating to the act, take that person before a court having jurisdiction for trial, detain
15	that person in custody at the expense of the state until arraignment and to make and execute
16	complaints within any district to the justice or clerk of the court against any person for any of the
17	offenses enumerated under the act committed within the district.
18	(V) Boating safety enforcement officers shall not be required to give surety for costs
19	upon any complaint made by him or her.
20	(iii) The development and administration of a coordinated safe boating program.
21	(iv) The establishment and enforcement of such rules and regulations as are deemed
22	necessary to achieve the purposes of the Model Safe Boating Act as approved by the state boating
23	law administrators.
24	(v) The state boating law administrator shall serve as the liaison to the United States
25	Coast Guard.

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SECTION 7. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

OF

AN ACT

RELATING TO FISH AND WILDLIFE -- LICENSING, MANAGEMENT, AND AQUACULTURE

1	This act would amend various provisions of the general laws pertaining to fish and
2	wildlife with regards to licensing, funding, and the assessment of fees. This act would also clarify
3	the duties of the division of fish and wildlife to include all marine vertebrates and invertebrates
4	and would expand the division of forest environment to include inland fisheries, wildlife
5	management, conservation programs, preservation and improvements of habitats and wetlands.
6	This act would take effect upon passage.
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
