RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT -- DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 42-11 of the General Laws entitled "Department of 1 2 Administration" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section: 3 <u>42-11-2.5. State fleet replacement.</u> – <u>In order to reduce fuel consumption, improve fuel</u> efficiency to a minimum of federal corporate average fuel economy (CAFE) standards, reduce 4 pollution emissions, and purchase vehicles that provide the best value on a lifecycle cost basis: 5 6 (1) State feet motor vehicle purchases shall comply with the Energy Policy Act of 1992 7 by ensuring that a minimum of seventy-five percent (75%) of the vehicles purchased shall be 8 alternative fueled and the remaining twenty-five percent (25%) of all new vehicles purchased 9 shall be hybrid electric vehicles to the greatest extent possible. 10 (2) Unless there is a demonstrated need to the contrary, all new light duty trucks in the 11 state fleet will achieve a minimum of nineteen miles per gallon (19 mpg) city for the fleet and be 12 certified as a low emission vehicle. All new passenger vehicles will achieve a minimum of 13 twenty-three miles per gallon (23 mpg) city for the state fleet. The department of administration 14 will periodically review these standards with the objective of achieving greater fuel efficiency 15 than the federal standards for the state fleet. (3) The department of administration shall continue to apply the state fleet operations 16 SUV policy to discourage the purchase of sport utility vehicles. All state agencies shall purchase 17

the most economical, fuel efficient and low emission vehicles appropriate to the mission.

1	(4) Fleet operators shall investigate the use of low rolling resistance specifications for the
2	purchase of replacement tires for the fleet's passenger vehicles and trucks, and shall require
3	bidders on replacement tire contracts to submit information on rolling resistance using an
4	appropriate Society of Automotive Engineers test procedure. Fleet operators shall purchase low
5	rolling resistance tires that also have superior tread life when possible. Emergency vehicles are
6	exempt from this provision.
7	(5) Since proper vehicle maintenance can reduce greenhouse gases and other pollutant
8	emissions, all state fleet vehicles shall be maintained according to manufacturer specifications,
9	including maintaining specified tire pressures and ratings.
10	(6) The director of the department of administration shall annually prepare a report on the
11	state's compliance and fuel efficiency goals articulated in this section. The report shall be
12	distributed to the governor, the general assembly and the department of environmental
13	management.
14	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

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EXPLANATION

This act would require the department of administration to purchase economical fuel efficient and low emission vehicles when feasible and to purchase low rolling resistance tires.

This act would take effect upon passage.

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
