It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 27-18-48 of the General Laws in Chapter 27-18 entitled "Accident
 and Sickness Insurance Policies" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 27-18-48. Third party reimbursement for services of certain health care workers. --4 (a) Every individual or group hospital or medical services plan contract delivered, issued or 5 renewed by an insurer or nonprofit or for profit health service corporation which provides benefits to individual subscribers and members within the state, or to all group members having a 6 7 principal place of employment within the state, shall provide benefits for services rendered by a 8 certified registered nurse anesthetist designated as a certified registered nurse anesthetist by the 9 board of nurse registration and nursing education; provided, that the following conditions are met: 10 (1) The certified registered nurse anesthetist provides certain health care services under 11 the supervision of anesthesiologists, licensed physicians or licensed dentists in accordance with 12 section 5-34.2-2(c), which requires substantial specialized knowledge, judgment and skill related 13 to the administration of anesthesia, including pre-operative and post-operative assessment of 14 patients; administering anesthetics; monitoring patients during anesthesia; management of fluids 15 in intravenous therapy and management of respiratory care; The certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA) provides certain health care services in collaboration with anesthesiologists, 16 17 licensed physicians, or licensed dentists in accordance with § 5-31.1-1(16) which requires 18 substantial specialized knowledge, judgment and skill related to the administration of anesthesia, 19 including preoperative and postoperative assessment of patients; administering anesthetics;

1 monitoring patients during anesthesia; management of fluid in intravenous therapy and 2 management of respiratory care. It also includes, in connection with the immediate perioperative 3 care of a patient, the ability to issue a medication order for drugs or medications to be 4 administered by a licensed, certified, or registered health care provider; to order and evaluate 5 laboratory and diagnostic test results and perform point of care testing that the CRNA is qualified to perform; and order and evaluate radiographic imaging studies that the CRNA is qualified to 6 order and interpret. For the purposes of this section, the "immediate perioperative care" of a 7 8 patient shall be defined as the period commencing on the day prior to surgery and ending upon

Nothing contained in this section shall preclude the health maintenance organization from conducting managed care, medical necessity or utilization review.

11 <u>assistants. --</u> (a) Every individual or group health insurance contract, plan or policy delivered, 12 issued or renewed by an insurer or nonprofit or for profit health service corporation which 13 provides benefits to individual subscribers and members within the state, or to all group members 14 having a principal place of employment within the state, shall provide benefits for services 15 rendered by a registered nurse first assistant designated as a registered nurse first assistant 16 provided, that the following conditions are met:

17 (1) The registered nurse first assistant provides certain health care services under the supervision of a licensed physician; is currently licensed as a registered nurse in Rhode Island; 18 19 has successfully completed a course in preparing the registered nurse as a first assistant in 20 accordance with the Association of Operating Room Nurses core curriculum guide for the 21 registered nurse first assistant and includes a minimum of one academic year in a college or 22 university with didactic instruction and clinical internship programs; and is certified in 23 perioperative nursing by the Certification Board Perioperative Nursing (minimum of two (2) 24 years perioperative experience); The registered nurse first assistant provides certain health care 25 services in collaboration with anesthesiologists, licensed physicians, or licensed dentists in 26 accordance with § 5-31.1-1(16) which requires substantial specialized knowledge, judgment and 27 skill related to the administration of anesthesia, including preoperative and postoperative 28 assessment of patients; administering anesthetics; monitoring patients during anesthesia; 29 management of fluid in intravenous therapy and management of respiratory care. It also includes, 30 in connection with the immediate perioperative care of a patient, the ability to issue a medication 31 order for drugs or medications to be administered by a licensed, certified, or registered health care 32 provider; to order and evaluate laboratory and diagnostic test results and perform point of care testing that the registered nurse first assistant is qualified to perform; and order and evaluate 33 34 radiographic imaging studies that the registered nurse first assistant is qualified to order and 1 interpret. For the purposes of this section, the "immediate perioperative care" of a patient shall be

9 (b) It shall remain within the sole discretion of the nonprofit hospital service corporation 10 as to which registered nurse first assistant it shall contract with. Reimbursement shall be provided 11 according to the respective principles and policies of the nonprofit hospital service corporation; 12 provided, that no nonprofit hospital service corporation may be required to provide direct 13 reimbursement, or pay for duplicative services actually rendered by a registered nurse first 14 assistant in surgery and any other health care provider. Third party reimbursement for services of certain health care workers. --8 (a) Every individual or group health insurance contract, plan or policy delivered, issued or 9 renewed by an insurer, health maintenance organization, nonprofit or for profit health service 10 corporation which provides benefits to individual subscribers and members within the state, or to 11 all group members having a principal place of employment within the state, shall provide benefits 12 for services rendered by a certified registered nurse anesthetist designated as a certified registered 13 nurse anesthetist by the board of nurse registration and nursing education; provided, that the 14 following conditions are met:

15 (1) The certified registered nurse anesthetist provides certain health care services under 16 the supervision of anesthesiologists, licensed physicians or licensed dentists in accordance with 17 section 5 34.2 2(c), which requires substantial specialized knowledge, judgment and skill related 18 to the administration of anesthesia, including pre-operative and post operative assessment of 19 patients; administering anesthetics; monitoring patients during anesthesia; management of fluids 20 in intravenous therapy and management of respiratory care; The certified registered nurse 21 anesthetist (CRNA) provides certain health care services in collaboration with anesthesiologists, 22 licensed physicians, or licensed dentists which requires substantial specialized knowledge, 23 judgment, and skill related to the administration of anesthesia, including preoperative and 24 postoperative assessment of patients; administering anesthetics; monitoring patients during 25 anesthesia; management of fluid in intravenous therapy and management of respiratory care. Nothing contained in this section shall preclude the health maintenance 11 organization from conducting managed care, medical necessity or utilization review.
