| 1 | WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by many as Lou Gehrig's |
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| 2 | disease, is a progressive, fatal neurodegenerative disease that attacks nerve cells in the brain and |
| 3 | spinal cord, making even the simplest movements such as walking, speaking, and gesturing |
| 4 | nearly impossible; and, |
| 5 | WHEREAS, Approximately 30,000 individuals in the United States are afflicted with |
| 6 | ALS at any given time, with 5,000 new cases appearing each year; and, |
| 7 | WHEREAS, Approximately 15 new cases of ALS are diagnosed every day, and every 90 |
| 8 | minutes someone loses their battle with the disease; and, |
| 9 | WHEREAS, ALS can strike anyone regardless of race, sex, age, or ethnicity, which is |
| 10 | why finding the cause of and cure for ALS will prevent the disease from taking more lives; and, |
| 11 | WHEREAS, Aggressive treatments of the symptoms of ALS can extend the lives of |
| 12 | those living with the disease; and |
| 13 | WHEREAS, Raising public awareness of this disease will facilitate the discovery of a |
| 14 | cure and bring much needed support and services to families in Rhode Island and across the |
| 15 | nation who are dealing with ALS; now, therefore be it |
| 16 | RESOLVED, That this Senate of the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations |
| 17 | hereby proclaims the month of May, 2010, to be "ALS Advocacy Month." We furthermore urge |
| 18 | all the citizens of the state to educate themselves on ALS and to help combat this disease by all |
| 19 | means possible; and be it further |
