CONGRATULATING MARY SULLIVAN, PH.D., R.N., ON HER ELECTION AS A "FELLOW OF THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF NURSING"

WHEREAS, The very nature of the nursing profession demands rigorous and continuous 1 2 academic development. For both the student and the professor, the challenges are countless, but the rewards are life-changing and life-saving; and 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Mary Sullivan graduated from Salve Regina College with a 4 baccalaureate degree in nursing, and then earned her graduate degree and doctor of philosophy 5 degree in nursing at the University of Nebraska and the University of Rhode Island, respectively; 6 7 and 8 WHEREAS, Under a new five-year grant, Dr. Sullivan is conducting a research program 9 that examines the developmental outcomes of premature infants. Currently, it is the only study of 10 its kind to examine the impact of prematurity, medical history, and environments on achievement 11 and concerns through young adulthood; and 12 WHEREAS, Dr. Sullivan has authored and co-authored numerous articles on a panoply 13 of issues and health concerns relating to premature birth. She has also taught undergraduate 14 courses in childbearing and reproductive health, and has led graduate courses in research methods 15 and concept development; and 16 WHEREAS, In the field of nursing and healthcare, there exist many awards and honors bestowed upon those individuals whose leadership and dedication are extraordinary. Dr. Sullivan 17

has been the recipient of a plethora of commendations, but perhaps none are as prestigious as an

invitation to become a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (AAN Fellow); and
