## HOUSE BILL NO. 1032

Introduced by: The Committee on Transportation at the request of the Department of Transportation

- FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding stopping for
  pedestrians at crosswalks.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 32-27-1 be amended to read as follows:
- 5 32-27-1. The driver of any vehicle upon a highway within a business or residence district
- 6 shall yield the right-of-way to shall bring the vehicle to a complete stop for a pedestrian crossing
- 7 the highway entering or within any clearly marked crosswalk or any regular pedestrian crossing
- 8 included in the prolongation of the lateral boundary lines of the adjacent sidewalk at the end of
- 9 a block, except at intersections where the movement of traffic is being regulated by traffic
- 10 officers or traffic direction devices <u>until the pedestrian has completed crossing</u>.
- 11 If there is a divided highway with a median, the driver may proceed once the pedestrian has
- 12 proceeded through the driver's lane and has reached the median.
- 13 If any vehicle is stopped at a crosswalk, or other pedestrian crossing to permit a pedestrian
- 14 to cross, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall also stop until the
- 15 pedestrian has completed crossing. However, no pedestrian may suddenly leave a curb or other



1 place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close as to constitute an

2 immediate hazard. A violation of this section by a driver is a petty offense <u>Class 2 misdemeanor</u>.

- 3 <u>This section does not apply if the movement of traffic is being regulated by a traffic officer</u>
- 4 or traffic direction device.
