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### 2021 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1044

Introduced by: **Representatives** Bordeaux, Haugaard, Phil Jensen, Pourier, Randolph, and St. John and **Senators** Heinert, Foster, and V. J. Smith at the request of the Committee on State-Tribal Relations

#### 1 An Act to transfer the Office of Indian Education to the Department of Education.

- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 3 Section 1. That § 1-54-11 be AMENDED.

#### 1-54-11. Office of Indian Education established.

5 The Office of Indian Education is hereby established within the Department of Tribal 6 Relations Education. The Office of Indian Education shall support initiatives in order that 7 South Dakota's students and public school instructional staff become aware of and gain 8 an appreciation of South Dakota's unique American Indian culture. The secretary of the 9 Department of Tribal Relations education shall appoint an Indian Education Advisory 10 Council. The council shall consist of representatives of all nine tribes in South Dakota along with Native American educators from all parts of the state. The nine representatives of 11 12 the tribes shall be appointed from nominations submitted by the tribal councils of each of 13 the tribes. The council members shall serve for three-year terms.

14 Section 2. That § 1-54-12 be AMENDED.

## 15 1-54-12. Indian Education Advisory Council to consult with Department of 16 Education regarding Oceti Sakowin Essential Understandings.

17 The Department of Education shall consult with the Indian Education Advisory 18 Council within the Department of Tribal Relations to develop and review the Oceti Sakowin 19 Essential Understandings. The consultation process shall align with the standards revision 20 cycle established by the Board of Education Standards pursuant to § 13-3-48.

21 **Section 3.** That § 1-54-13 be AMENDED.

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There is hereby established the Native American achievement schools grant program to be administered by the Office of Indian Education-within the Department of Tribal Relations. The purpose of the grant program is to fund the establishment of up to three Native American achievement school projects aimed at improving academic outcomes for Native American students.

7 Section 4. That § 1-54-14 be AMENDED.

# 8 1-54-14. Eligibility requirements for Native American achievement schools 9 grant applicants.

- 10 An applicant seeking a grant from the Native American achievement schools grant 11 program shall:
- 12 (1) Be an accredited public school within the State of South Dakota;
- (2) Serve a student population for which the school-level results for the 2014-15
  academic year on the state academic assessment are below the statewide average
  proficiency in English language arts and mathematics;
- 16 (3) Serve a student population of which at least fifty percent is comprised of Native
  17 American students;
- 18 (4) Demonstrate access to a physical facility that is adequate for implementation of the
  project; and
- 20 (5) Demonstrate the ability to complete the project in accordance with all requirements
  21 of <u>§§</u> 1-54-13 to 1-54-20, inclusive, sections 3 to 10, inclusive, of this Act, state
  22 and federal laws and regulations, and policies of the <u>department Department of</u>
  23 <u>Education</u>.

24 **Section 5.** That § 1-54-15 be AMENDED.

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### 1-54-15. Criteria for priority projects.

In selecting grant recipients, the <u>department\_Department of Education</u> shall give priority to projects that meet the requirements of this chapter and show commitment to increasing student success through building cultural identities, encouraging academic perseverance, supporting the development of the whole child, and encouraging student leadership skills by demonstrating one or more of the following characteristics:

(1) Offering programming designed to lead to postsecondary readiness and work
 readiness;

1	(2)	Supporting the recruitment and retention of highly effective teachers and
2		administrators;
3	(3)	Demonstrating commitment to the implementation of the Oceti Sakowin Essential
4		Understandings and Standards across the curriculum;
5	(4)	Demonstrating a commitment to the implementation of courses offering instruction
6		in Dakota, Lakota, or Nakota languages;
7	(5)	Maintaining a school environment that cultivates diversity of the student population
8		and promotes a sense of belonging;
9	(6)	Forming partnerships with community organizations or governmental entities; and
10	(7)	Planning for sustainability.
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- 11 Section 6. That § 1-54-16 be AMENDED.
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#### 1-54-16. Application process.

The department <u>Department of Education</u> shall inform potential applicants of the application and award period and of the amount of funding available for the grants. The department shall also provide the application form and scoring rubric that informs potential applicants of the weight to be assigned to each characteristic referenced in § 1-<u>54-15</u> section 5 of this Act\_within the selection process. Applicants shall complete the application form and provide any additional information requested by the department. The application is not complete until all necessary information is submitted.

20 **Section 7.** That § 1-54-17 be AMENDED.

#### 1-54-17. Determination of grant recipients and award amounts.

The department <u>Department of Education</u>, with the assistance of a group of reviewers designated by the secretary of tribal relations education, shall determine grant recipients and award amounts utilizing a competitive process. The group of reviewers shall include three members of the Indian Education Advisory Council established pursuant to  $\frac{91-54-11}{54-11}$  section 1 of this Act.

27 **Section 8.** That § 1-54-18 be AMENDED.

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#### 1-54-18. Conditions applicable to grant recipients.

In addition to complying with the requirements in § 1-54-16 section 6 of this Act and the additional requirements of chapter 13-14, all grant recipients will be subject to the following conditions:

1	(1)	The amount of a grant may not exceed the actual cost of the project as proposed
2		in the application;
3	(2)	The grant shall be paid on a reimbursement basis, following procedures and
4		requirements outlined by the department <u>Department of Education</u> ;
5	(3)	Any funds provided through the grant must be necessary and reasonable to
6		complete the project;
7	(4)	Necessary documentation, as determined by the department, shall be submitted to
8		support all expenditures;
9	(5)	Expenditures must be approved before the end of the grant period;
10	(6)	A grant project must expend all funds provided through the grant within thirty-six
11		months following grant approval; and
12	(7)	No grant funds may be used for costs associated with writing the grant proposal,
13		contractual obligations that became effective prior to the award period of the grant,
14		purchases that become the property of any individual or organization other than
15		the grant recipient, or purchases or services beyond the project outcomes or
16		activities.

17 Section 9. That § 1-54-19 be AMENDED.

#### 18 **1-54-19. Grant recipient reports--Access to facilities and records.**

19 Each grant recipient shall submit grant status reports to the department 20 Department of Education on a quarterly basis, and a final grant report including data 21 related to the implementation of the project. The department shall determine the details 22 required in the reports and the deadlines for report submissions. Each grant recipient shall 23 provide the department with reasonable access to facilities and records that may be 24 necessary for the department to determine compliance with the terms of the grant and all 25 the requirements of  $\frac{1}{5}$  1-54-13 to 1-54-20, inclusive sections 3 to 10, inclusive, of this 26 Act.

- 27 Section 10. That § 1-54-20 be AMENDED.
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#### 1-54-20. Default--Repayment--Civil action.

The submission of false or misleading statements or information as part of a grant application or the failure to comply with any requirement shall be considered a default upon the terms of a grant. In the event of a default, the <u>department Department of</u> <u>Education may</u> require the grant recipient to repay any funds dispersed under the grant to the department within thirty days of a written demand from the department. The

- 1 department may begin a civil action to recover any grant funds that a grant recipient is
- 2 required to repay under this section.
- 3 **Section 11.** <u>That §§ 1-54-11 and 1-54-12 be transferred to chapter 1-45.</u>
- 4 **Section 12.** That §§ 1-54-13 to 1-54-20, inclusive, be transferred to chapter 13-14.
