- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide a tuition benefit to certain teachers who enroll
- 2 in courses under the management and control of the Board of Regents that are not
- 3 subsidized by the general fund.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 5 Section 1. That § 13-55-24 be amended to read as follows:
- 6 13-55-24. Any elementary or secondary teacher or vocational instructor who is required to 7 take college courses as a condition of employment or to maintain a certificate to teach may, 8 upon compliance with § 13-55-27 and all of the requirements for admission, attend and pursue 9 any undergraduate or graduate course in any state educational institution under the control and 10 management of the Board of Regents upon the payment of fifty percent of tuition and one 11 hundred percent of required fees. If the teacher enrolls in a distance education course under the 12 control and management of the Board of Regents or other course under the control and 13 management of the Board of Regents that is not subsidized by the general fund, the teacher is 14 entitled to a benefit of fifty percent of the tuition to be paid to the institution by the Board of

- 1 Regents based on the in-state resident tuition rate. The Board of Regents shall maintain an
- 2 annual record of the number of participants and the tuition dollar value of such participation.
