1	FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to amend certain provisions related to interpreter services
2	in the court system.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
4	Section 1. That § 19-3-8 be repealed.
5	19-3-8. Any person may be subpoenaed by any court or judge to appear and act as interpreter
6	in any hearing. The subpoena shall be served and returned in the same manner as a subpoena
7	for a witness. Disobedience to such subpoena is contempt of the court.
8	Section 2. That § 19-14-4 be repealed.
9	19-14-4. An interpreter is subject to the provisions of chapter 19-15 relating to qualification
10	as an expert and the administration of an oath or affirmation that he will make a true translation.
11	Section 3. That § 19-14-4.1 be amended to read as follows:
12	19-14-4.1. The following oath, as appropriate to the circumstances, may be used to satisfy
13	the requirements of § 19-14-4 for an interpreter:
14	You do solemnly swear that you will justly, truly, and impartially interpret to the oath
15	about to be administered to him; and the questions which may be asked him and the answers

1 that he shall give to such questions, relative to the cause now under consideration before this court (or officer), so help you God. I, ______, do solemnly swear (or affirm) 2 that I will justly, truly and impartially interpret, to the best of my skill and judgment, and will 3 4 make a true interpretation to any party or witness, the oath or affirmation administered in all 5 matters; the questions which may be asked and the answers that shall be given to such questions 6 and all statements relative to any [court proceedings, probation activities, or any other proceeding] under consideration in which I am employed to interpret, so help me God (under 7 8 the pains and penalties of perjury).
