## HOUSE BILL NO. 1075

Introduced by: Representatives Hickey, Bolin, Mickelson, Novstrup (Al), Rounds, Verchio, and Willadsen and Senators Curd, Greenfield (Brock), and Olson

- FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide for off-road vehicle trails, to establish a fund to
   create and maintain the trails, and to provide a penalty therefor.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. The Department of Game, Fish and Parks may require an off-road vehicle trail

5 permit to operate an off-road vehicle on state off-road vehicle trails. The Game, Fish and Parks

- 6 Commission shall, by rules promulgated pursuant to chapter 1-26, establish an annual off-road
- 7 vehicle permit fee for residents and nonresidents. The off-road vehicle trail permit allows the

8 use of an off-road vehicle on all state off-road vehicle trails, including portions of the highway

- 9 that are not marked as an off-road vehicle free zone. The moneys from the off-road vehicle trail
- 10 permit fees shall be deposited in the off-road vehicle trail fund.
- 11 Section 2. There is hereby established the off-road vehicle trail fund in the state treasury for
- 12 the purpose of establishing and maintaining off-road vehicle trails in the state.
- 13 Section 3. The moneys in the off-road vehicle trail fund established pursuant to section 2 of
- 14 this Act are hereby appropriated for the administration of this Act. Moneys in the fund shall
- 15 accumulate without reversion at the close of the fiscal year.



1 Section 4. The Department of Game, Fish and Parks shall, as rapidly as the accumulation 2 of funds in the off-road vehicle trails fund permits, establish state off-highway vehicle trails and 3 areas. The Game, Fish and Parks Commission is hereby authorized to expend such funds for the 4 construction, maintenance, and marking of trails, including payments for the acquisition or 5 leasing of land or easements and payments to the Department of Transportation for ditch 6 maintenance, and for off-road vehicle safety programs and initiatives. 7 Section 5. Disbursements from the off-road vehicle trail fund shall be paid on warrants 8 drawn by the state auditor on vouchers approved by the Game, Fish and Parks Commission. 9 Section 6. The use of state off-road vehicle trails by any person operating an off-road vehicle 10 without an off-road vehicle trail license is a Class 2 misdemeanor. 11 Section 7. The Department of Game, Fish and Parks may place signs within any public 12 right-of-way providing directions to a state owned or managed public use area.

Section 8. Notwithstanding § 32-20-2, a minor may operate an off-road vehicle on a portion of the public street or highway that is not marked as an off-road vehicle free zone as long as the minor is twelve years or older and is operating the off-road vehicle under the direct supervision of a licensed parent or guardian.

17 Section 9. That § 32-20-12 be amended to read as follows:

18 32-20-12. No person may operate on a public street or highway an off-road vehicle except 19 for crossing from one side of the road to the other. A person twelve years of age or older may 20 operate an off-road vehicle in a highway ditch if the vehicle is operated as close as possible to 21 the outer edge of the highway right-of-way. However, no person may operate an off-road vehicle 22 in a highway ditch along the interstate highway system, or operate an off-road vehicle on any 23 lands owned, leased, or controlled by the Department of Game, Fish and Parks, or any highway 24 ditch located within, except on a designated off-road vehicle area or designated trail, or operate an off-road vehicle in a highway ditch that is designated as part of the state snowmobile trails

system pursuant to chapter 41-19 or on a public bike trail. A violation of this section is a Class
2 misdemeanor.
Off-road vehicles need not be registered and licensed for use upon the highways except as
provided in § 32-20-13 unless the off-road vehicle is operated on a portion of the highway or
road that is marked as an off-road vehicle free zone. Off-road vehicles shall be titled. The
Department of Revenue shall issue a certificate of title for off-road vehicles the same as for

8 other motor vehicles subject to the provisions of chapter 32-3.
