1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the arrest of certain
2 victims of domestic abuse.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 25-10-36.1 be amended to read:

5 25-10-36.1. No law enforcement officer; who is called to the scene of a domestic abuse
6 complaint; is required to arrest any victim of domestic abuse for an outstanding warrant if:

7 (1) The victim is not otherwise liable to arrest for any action arising out of the present
8 incidence of domestic abuse; and

9 (2) The outstanding warrant is for a nonviolent misdemeanor offense; ~~and~~

10 ~~—(3)—~~ ~~The victim is the custodial parent or immediate caregiver of a minor child.~~

11 ~~However, the~~ The victim is subject to arrest on ~~any~~ an outstanding warrant after seventy-two



1 hours have passed since the incidence of the domestic abuse call under this section.

2 The decision of an officer to arrest or not to arrest a victim on an outstanding warrant ~~does~~

3 under this section may not constitute a cause of action against the officer, the law enforcement

4 agency, the employing entity, or any of the employing entity's employees.
