1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding increases in teacher 2 compensation. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 3 Section 1. That § 13-13-73.6 be amended to read: 4 5 13-13-73.6. The Department of Education shall calculate the following for each school 6 district: 7 The average teacher salary, for each school district based on data collected pursuant 8 to §§ 13-8-47 and 13-3-51; 9 The increase in local need pursuant to § 13-13-10.1, excluding any effect due to 10 change in the school district's fall enrollment and less the amount of revenue 11 generated in school fiscal year 2016 pursuant to § 13-10-6 as a percentage increase, 12 from fiscal year 2016 to fiscal year 2017; and 13 The increase in average teacher compensation as a percentage increase, as defined in 14 § 13-8-47, from fiscal year 2016 to fiscal year 2017.

1 For each school district, the district's increase in average teacher compensation from fiscal 2 year 2016 to 2017 shall be equal to at least eighty-five percent of the district's increase in local 3 need, as defined in subdivision (2), from fiscal year 2016 to fiscal year 2017 and, 4 notwithstanding any negotiated agreement, at least eighty-five percent of the increase in state 5 aid to general education funding the school district receives for fiscal year 2017 less the amount 6 of revenue generated in fiscal year 2016 pursuant to § 13-10-6 shall be used to increase 7 instructional salaries and benefits for certified instructional staff. 8 If a district fails to comply with the requirements of this section, state aid to general 9 education funding to the district in fiscal year 2018 shall be decreased by an amount equal to 10 fifty percent of the amount calculated in subdivision (2). For fiscal years 2019, 2020, and 2021 11 year 2019 and for each fiscal year thereafter, if a district's average teacher compensation is less 12 than the district's average teacher compensation in the prior fiscal year 2017 when increased by 13 sixty-five percent of the actual percent change in the target teacher salary, as defined in 13-13-14 10.1, state aid to general education funding to the district in the following fiscal year shall be 15 reduced by an amount equal to five hundred dollars for each teacher employed in the school 16 district. 17 A school district may request a waiver from any penalty imposed under this section from 18 the School Finance Accountability Board. 19 If a school district's average teacher compensation is greater than the target teacher 20 compensation outlined in § 13-13-10.1, the school district is exempt from the accountabilities 21 outlined in this section for the following fiscal year.
