

## 2024 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1167

Introduced by: **Representative** Jensen (Phil)

## An Act to clarify determinations regarding the injection of a COVID-19 vaccine. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

## **Section 1. That chapter 60-4 be amended with a NEW SECTION:**

4		Each individual employed in this state, whether in the public or private sector, has
5	<u>the ric</u>	to evaluate information regarding the efficacy of being injected with a COVID-19
6	vaccin	e and determine whether or not to receive the vaccination.
7		For purposes of this section, the term "evaluate information" means to:
8	<u>(1)</u>	Consider the findings of peer reviewed studies regarding the efficacy of a COVID-
9		<u>19 vaccine;</u>
10	<u>(2)</u>	Seek guidance from credible medical sources regarding the efficacy of a COVID-19
11		vaccine;
12	<u>(3)</u>	Seek recommendations from personal medical practitioners regarding the efficacy
13		of a COVID-19 vaccine and prophylactic medicines or treatments for airborne
14		respiratory infections, including coronavirus;
15	<u>(3)</u>	Consider the benefits and risks of being injected with a COVID-19 vaccine, given
16		one's age and overall health and well-being; and
17	<u>(4)</u>	Consider the health needs of, vulnerabilities of, and implications for immediate
18		family members.
19		If an individual determines that being injected with a COVID-19 vaccine is not
20	persor	nally justifiable, the individual's employer may require that the individual work at an
21	altern	ate location within the same building or work from home, provided doing so is
22	compatible with the individual's work responsibilities. The employer may not terminate,	
23	demote, discipline, or take any other adversarial action against the individual based on	
24	<u>the in</u>	dividual's determination under this section.

1	An individual aggrieved by an action of the individual's employer under this section
2	may bring a civil suit for damages in circuit court and may sue for all wages and benefits
3	that would have accrued, up to and including the date of the judgment.
4	This section is not applicable to an individual whose employer must, in accordance
5	with federal statute or regulation, require that anyone serving in the individual's position
6	be injected with a COVID-19 vaccine, as a condition of employment in that specified
7	position.
