## **House Bill 1170**

Introduced by: Representative Jensen (Phil)

An Act to allow a licensed distiller to sell and ship distilled spirits directly to a consumer.

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 35-13:

Both a licensed artisan distiller and a licensed distiller may each sell and ship the licensed entity's distilled spirits to any individual in this state who is twenty-one years or older.

Both a licensed artisan distiller and a licensed distiller may each sell and ship the licensed entity's distilled spirits to any individual outside this state who is twenty-one years or older, in a manner consistent with the laws of the state and political subdivision of the sale and delivery.

Under this section, a licensed artisan distiller or a licensed distiller may not sell and ship in excess of twenty-five thousand gallons in a calendar year and may not sell and ship in excess of two liters of distilled spirits to any one individual in a calendar year.

To sell and ship under this section, the licensed artisan distiller or licensed distiller must also meet the requirements in sections 2 and 3 of this Act.

## Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 35-13:

To sell and ship directly to an individual pursuant to section 1 of this Act, the licensed artisan distiller or licensed distiller must:

- (1) Obtain a distilled spirits direct shipper license if selling and shipping a product to an individual in South Dakota, or if selling and shipping a product from South Dakota to an individual in another state;
- (2) Use an approved carrier that checks identification and obtains an adult signature for each shipment of the licensee's distilled spirits;
- 25 (3) Verify the age of the purchaser and the recipient of the licensee's distilled spirits;

1	<u>(4)</u>	Label each shipped box containing the licensee's distilled spirits with a notice
2		stating that the box contains alcohol and that a signature of an individual twenty-
3		one years or older is required;
4	<u>(5)</u>	Abide by per-person volume limits;
5	<u>(6)</u>	Remit all applicable sales and excise taxes to the state of South Dakota or to the
6		destination state if shipping outside of South Dakota; and
7	<u>(7)</u>	File regular reports with the Department of Revenue detailing all direct-to-
8		consumer shipments.
9	Section 3	3. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 35-13:
10		An applicant for an initial or renewal of the direct shipper license must:
11	(1)	File an application with the Department of Revenue on a form prescribed by the
12		department;
13	(2)	Pay a license fee of not more than one hundred dollars;
14	<u>(3)</u>	Submit a copy of the applicant's current federal basic distilled spirits manufacturing
15		permit;
16	<u>(4)</u>	Register each brand label offered for sale in this state, if not previously registered,
17		and pay all applicable brand registration fees pursuant to chapter 39-13;
18	<u>(5)</u>	Hold a South Dakota sales and use tax license issued by the department; and
19	<u>(6)</u>	Be current on the remittance of all applicable state and local taxes.
20		The department shall issue a distilled spirits direct shipper license to any applicant
21	who n	neets the requirements of this Act.
22	Section 4	4. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 35-13:
23		Each distilled spirits direct shipper license is valid from the first day of January
24	through the thirty-first day of December. However, the license is valid for an additional	
25	three	days if a proper application for a new license is in the possession of the department
26	<u>before</u>	e midnight on the thirty-first day of December when the license expires. The full fee
27	shall l	be charged for any license for a portion of the period.
28	Section !	5. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 35-13:
29		The secretary shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, establishing any
30	neces	sary application procedures for obtaining a distilled spirits direct shipper license as

allowed by this Act and establishing the fee for issuing a distilled spirits direct shipper

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license. The rules must also establish form requirements for filing direct shipment reports
under section 2 of this Act. The direct-to-consumer shipment reports must include the
volume of distilled spirits shipped directly to individuals, destination states, sales volume
