- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide for an Indian Child Welfare Act court
- 2 monitoring program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. The Department of Social Services, through agreements with one or more Indian
- 5 tribes in South Dakota, shall establish and implement an Indian Child Welfare Act court
- 6 monitoring program. The court monitoring program shall designate court monitors who will
- 7 attend court hearings and proceedings to monitor compliance with the federal Indian Child
- 8 Welfare Act, 25 U.S.C. 1901 to 1963, as amended to January 1, 2013, in an effort to protect the
- 9 rights of Native American children and families. The court monitor program shall also provide
- 10 consultation and technical assistance to social and human services systems and the legal system
- on matters relating to Indian Child Welfare Act cases. As a part of the program, trained
- observers shall gather information on compliance at court hearings. Information and data shall
- be compiled and sent to all key stakeholders, such as tribal officials, judges, attorneys, state and
- county agencies, and other affected parties. Under the program, a checklist of actions that must

- 1 occur for each type of hearing to be in compliance with the Indian Child Welfare Act shall be
- 2 devised so that a court monitor, tribe, or advocate can complete the checklist at the hearing.
- 3 Data shall be entered into a central system and compiled to show incidences of, or larger
- 4 patterns of noncompliance.
