SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES ENGROSSED NO. **HB 1214** - 03/04/2013

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to expand Medicaid eligibility for pregnant women and to
2 make an appropriation therefor.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. The Department of Social Services shall submit a Medicaid state plan amendment
5 to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to expand Medicaid eligibility for
6 pregnancy-related services for pregnant women up to one hundred forty percent of the federal
7 poverty level per household size.

8 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of four hundred sixty-
9 four thousand three hundred fifty-five dollars (\$464,355), or so much thereof as may be
10 necessary, and five hundred forty-nine thousand five hundred twenty-one dollars (\$549,521),
11 or so much thereof as may be necessary, of federal fund expenditure authority to the Department
12 of Social Services for the purpose of providing pregnancy-related services to pregnant women.

13 Section 3. The secretary of social services shall approve vouchers and the state auditor shall



1 draw warrants to pay expenditures authorized by this Act.

2 Section 4. Any amounts appropriated in this Act not lawfully expended or obligated by

3 June 30, 2014, shall revert in accordance with the procedures prescribed in chapter 4-8.

4 Section 5. The Department of Social Services shall provide a report to the Governor and the

5 Legislature by January 1, 2015. The report shall include birth outcomes and any estimated

6 savings.
