## HOUSE BILL No. 1250

Introduced by: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Office of the Governor

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the South Dakota opportunity scholarship program.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

Section 1. That § 13-55-31 be amended to read as follows:
13-55-31. In order to be eligible for a South Dakota opportunity scholarship award, a student shall:
(1) Be a resident of South Dakota at the time of graduation from high school;
(2) Have a composite score of 24 , or higher, on the test administered by the American College Testing Program or an equivalent score as determined by the Board of Regents on the Scholastic Assessment Test. The student shall take the ACT or SAT test before beginning postsecondary education;
(3) Meet the Successfully complete approved high school eourse requirements for graduation as provided in § 13-55-31.4 coursework which shall include:
(a) Four units of language arts;
(b) Three units of social studies:
(c) Four units of mathematics;
(d) Four units of science, including at least three units in laboratory science;
(e) Two units of world language (two years of the same language); and
(f) One unit of fine arts;
(4) Attend a university, college, or technical school that is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and that provides instruction from a campus located in South Dakota; and
(5) Enter into the program within five years of graduation from high school or within one year of the student's release from active duty with an active component of the armed forces if the release is within five years of the student's graduation from high school. If a student attends full-time a regionally accredited university, college, or technical school located outside South Dakota and within two years following high school graduation or within two years following release from active military service returns to the state to attend full-time a regionally accredited university, college, or technical school, the student is eligible to receive a partial award.

A student is eligible to participate in the South Dakota opportunity scholarship program for the equivalent of four academic years (eight consecutive spring and fall terms) or until the attainment of a baccalaureate degree, whichever comes first. However, the executive director of the Board of Regents may grant exceptions to the continuous enrollment requirements for good cause shown.

A student who would have been eligible for the scholarship, but who applies after completing one or more semesters of full-time work at an accredited institution, may be admitted to the program only if the student has complied with the same grade point and credit hour requirements that would apply to program participants. Admission granted under these
circumstances may not be retroactive, and eligibility for participation in the program shall be reduced by one semester for each semester of work completed prior to admission to the program.

Section 2. That § 13-55-31.1 be repealed.
13-55-31.1. To be eligible for an opportunity seholarship, a student who entered the ninth grade prior to the 2010-2011 sehool year shall complete the following high sehool course requirements:
(1) Four or more units of language arts that inelude a minimum of the following:
(a) One and one-half units of writing;
(b) One and one-half units of literature that must inelude one-half unit of Ameriean Literature;
(c) One-half unit of speech or debate, and
(d) One-half unit of a language arts eleetive;
(2) Three or more units of social studies that inelude the following:
(a) One unit of U.S. History,
(b) One-half unit of U.S. government,
— (e) One-half unit of geography,

- (d) One-half unit of world history, and
- (e) One-half unit of a social studies elective,
(3) Four units of mathematies that must include the following:
(a) One unit of algebra I,
-(b) One unit of geometry,
(e) One unit of algebra II, and
(d) One unit of advanced math,
(4) Four units of seience, including at least three units in laboratory seience, that must include the following:
(a) One unit of biology,
(b) One unit of any physieal seience,
(e) One unit of ehemistry or physies; and
(d) One unit of seience electives;
(5) Two units of world languages (two years of the same language),
(6) One-half unit of computer studies;
(7) One unit of fine arts;
(8) One-half unit of personal finance or economies, and
(9) One-half unit of physieal edueation or health.
- A student may earn aeademic core content eredit by completing an approved eareer and teehniealeducation course. Approval to offer credit for a eareer and teehniealedurationcourse must be obtained through an applieation process with the Department of Edueation. The Bepartment of Edueation shall meet with the Board of Regents to determine final course approval. The applieation must inelude.
(1) Course syllabus;
(2) Standards-based eurrieulum;
(3) Teachercentifieation, and
(4) Assessment of standards by methods ineluding end-of-eourse exams, authentie assessment, project-based learning or rubries.

To be eligible for an opportunity seholarship, a student who enters the ninth grade in the 2010-2011 sehool year or thereafter shall complete the following high sehool course requirements:

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(1) Four or more units of language arts that inelude a mininnum of the following:
(a) One and one-half units of writing;
(b) One and one-half units of literature that must include one-half unit of Ameriean literature,
(c) One-half unit of speech or debate, and
(d) One-half unit of a language arts eleetive;
(2) Three units or more of social studies that inelude the following:
(a) One unit of U.S. history;
(b) One-half unit of U.S. government;

- (c) One-half unit of geography,
(d) One-half unit of world history; and
(e) One-half unit of a social studies elective;
(3) Four units of mathematies that must inelude the following:
(a) One unit of algebra I,
(b) One unit of geometry,
(c) One unit of algebra II, and
(d) One unit of advanced math;
(4) Four units of seience, including at least three units in laboratory seience, that must include the following:
- (a) One unit of biology,
- (b) One unit of any physieal seienee;
-(e) One unit of chemistry or physies, and
(d) One unit of science electives;
(5) Two units of either of the following or a combination of the two:
(a) Approvedeareer and teehnieal edtueation courses, and
(b) World languages;

Approval for a career and technieal edtueation course must be obtained through an applieation proeess with the Department of Edtueation. The department shall meet with the Board of Regents to determine final course approvat,
(6) One-half unit of personal finanee or economies;
(7) One unit of fine arts;
(8) One-half unit of physical edueation, and
(9) For students entering the ninth grade in the 2013-2014 sehool year and thereafter, one-half unit of healtho or health integration.

A student may be granted up to one unit of eredit in fine arts for participation in extracurrieular aetivities. A maximum of one-fourth unit of eredit may be granted for each extraeurrieularactivity in which a student participates during each sehool year. In order to grant eredit for an extracurrieular activity, a sehool distriet must document the alignment of the activity with fine arts content standards approved by the South Dakota Board of Edtueation. -Students entering the ninth grade in the 2013-2014 sehool year and thereafter are required to take one-half unit of health at anytime during grades six through twelve. A sehool distriet may ehoose to integrate health across the eurrieulum at the middle or high sehool level in lieu of a stand-atone course.

A student may earn aeademic core content eredit by completing an approved eareer and teehnieal edtueation course. Approval to offer credit for acareer and teehnieal edtueation course must be obtained through an applieation process with the Department of Edueation. The Bepartment of Edueation shall meet with the Board of Regents to determine final course approval. The applieation must include:

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(1) Course syllabus,
(2) Standards-based eurrieulum;
(3) Teacher certifieation; and
(4) Assessment of standards by methods ineluding end-of-course exams, authentie assessment, project-based learning or rubries.

Section 3. That § 13-55-31.2 be repealed.
13-55-31.2. Any student who does not meet the highsehooleourse requirements as provided in subdivision 13-55-31(3) is eligible for the opportunity seholarship program if.
(1) The student takes the test administered by the Ameriean College Testing Program and earns a composite seore of twenty-eight or higher and achieves ACT college readiness benehmark seores equaling or exceeding eighteen for English, twenty-one for reading, twenty-two for math, and twenty-four for seience; or
(2) The student takes the Seholastic Assessment Test andearns a verbal-mathennaties seore of twelve hundred fifty or higher, while also attaining suffieiently high markers in reading, writing, mathematies, and seience as not to require remediation in any of those areas.
