## HOUSE BILL NO. 1276

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to create a task force to study the functioning of the Office
- 2 of Tribal Government Relations.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. There is hereby established the South Dakota Native Affairs Task Force. The task
- 5 force consists of the following members:
- 6 (1) For each of the nine Indian tribes located in South Dakota that chooses to participate
- 7 in the task force, the chairman or president of the tribe or a person designated by the
- 8 tribal chairman or tribal president to represent the participating tribe;
- 9 (2) The director of the Office of Tribal Government Relations;
- 10 (3) The current members of the State-Tribal Relations Committee; and
- 11 (4) A representative of the Office of the Governor.
- 12 If a vacancy on the task force occurs, the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the
- 13 original appointment.



Section 2. The task force shall be under the supervision of the Executive Board of the
 Legislative Research Council and staffed and funded as an interim legislative committee. The
 Legislative Research Council may receive additional funds from any legal source to carry out
 the purposes of this Act. The executive board shall designate the chair and the vice chair of the
 task force.

6 Section 3. In conjunction with the designation by Governor Rounds of 2010 as the "Year of 7 Unity" in South Dakota, the task force shall evaluate the mission, history, activities, functioning, 8 and effectiveness of the Office of Tribal Government Relations. The study shall also consider 9 other appropriate organizational structures, tasks, goals, and activities for other potential 10 ongoing entities designed to foster a closer working relationship between state government and 11 the tribes and to address issues affecting South Dakota's Native American and non-Native 12 populations.

Section 4. The task force shall begin its activities in 2010 and shall submit a report,
including its findings, recommendations, and potential draft legislation, to the Executive Board
of the Legislative Research Council not later than December 1, 2010.
