WHEREAS, the event brings in more than eighteen thousand visitors, including more than four thousand five hundred out-of-town attendees and about four thousand students from Rapid City area schools; and

WHEREAS, the Black Hills Powwow, already one of the largest in the world, continues to grow in attendance and support every year, bolstering Rapid City and surrounding communities' economies and bringing in more than \$4,000,000 in revenue while awarding championship singers and dancers a total prize payout of over \$150,000:
