- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Exposing and opposing United Nations Agenda 21.
- WHEREAS, the United Nations Agenda 21 is a comprehensive plan of extreme
- 3 environmentalism, social engineering, and global political control that was initiated at the
- 4 United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) held in Rio de Janeiro,
- 5 Brazil, in 1992; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the United Nations Agenda 21 is being covertly pushed into local communities
- 7 throughout the Untied States of America through the International Council of Local
- 8 Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI) through local "sustainable development" policies such as
- 9 Smart Growth, Wildlands Project, Resilient Cities, Regional Visioning Projects, and other
- 10 "Green" or "Alternative" projects; and
- WHEREAS, this United Nations Agenda 21 plan of radical so-called "sustainable
- development" views the American way of life of private property ownership, single family

- 6 WHEREAS, according to the United Nations Agenda 21 policy, national sovereignty is

- 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Eighty-
- 9 Eighth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, the Legislature
- 10 recognizes the destructive and insidious nature of United Nations Agenda 21 and hereby
- exposes to the public and public policy makers the dangerous intent of the plan; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the United States government and no state or local
- 13 government is legally bound by the United Nations Agenda 21 treaty in that it has never been
- 14 ratified by the United States Senate; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the federal, state, and local governments across the
- 16 country be well informed of the underlying harmful implications of implementation of United
- 17 Nations Agenda 21 destructive strategies for "sustainable development," and we hereby endorse
- rejection of its radical policies and rejection of any grant monies attached to it.
