## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1004

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION, To propose a constitutional amendment regarding legislative term
- 2 limits.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF SOUTH
- 4 DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
- 5 Section 1. That at the next general election held in the state, the following amendment to
- 6 Article III, section 6 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, as set forth in section 2
- 7 of this Joint Resolution, which is hereby agreed to, shall be submitted to the electors of the state
- 8 for approval.
- 9 Section 2. That Article III, section 6 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, be
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- § 6. The terms of office of the members of the Legislature shall be two years; they legislators
- shall receive for their services the salary fixed by law under the provisions of § 2 of article XXI
- of this Constitution, and five cents for every mile of necessary travel in going to and returning
- 14 from the place of meeting of the Legislature on the most usual route.

- 2 - HJR 1004

No person may serve more than four six consecutive terms or a total of eight twelve

2 consecutive years in the senate and more than four six consecutive terms or a total of eight

3 <u>twelve</u> consecutive years in the house of representatives. However, this restriction does not

4 apply to partial terms to which a legislator may be appointed.

5 A regular session of the Legislature shall be held each year and shall not exceed forty

6 legislative days, excluding Sundays, holidays and legislative recess, except in cases of

impeachment, and members of the Legislature shall receive no other pay or perquisites except

8 salary and mileage.
