Senate Bill 125

SENATE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES ENGROSSED

Introduced by: Senator Nesiba

- An Act to temporarily require the wearing of face coverings in the state under certain conditions and to declare an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 **Section 1. Definition--Indoor retail business.** For the purpose of this Act, the term, retail
- 5 <u>business, means any enclosed business operating as a bar, restaurant, brewery, café, casino,</u>
- 6 <u>coffee shop, recreational or athletic facility, health club, grocery store, market, retail store,</u>
- 7 <u>hardware store, sporting goods store, convenience store, home improvement store,</u>
- 8 pharmacy, drug store, food pantry, vehicle for hire, transportation networking company,
- 9 theater, or entertainment venue.
- 10 **Section 2. Mask requirement.** Within the state, all persons shall wear a face covering in an
- indoor retail business or a government-owned facility where six-foot social distancing cannot
- 12 <u>be achieved or maintained. A face covering shall be worn to cover the nose and mouth</u>
- completely, and can be a paper or disposable mask, a cloth mask, a scarf, a bandana, or a
- 14 neck gaiter.
- 15 **Section 3. Exceptions.** The requirements of section 2 of this Act do not apply to:
- 16 (1) A person under the age of five years old;
- 17 (2) A person seated at a public place to eat or drink, or while immediately consuming
 18 food or beverages;
- 19 (3) A person who is receiving dental or medical care that prevents the person from wearing a face covering;
- 21 (4) A person with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that makes 22 it unreasonable for the person to maintain a face covering;
- 23 (5) A person who is engaged in swimming or a team sports activity where the level of exertion makes it difficult to wear a face covering;

- 1 Public safety workers actively engaged in a public safety role, including law (6) 2 enforcement personnel, fire fighters, or emergency medical personnel, in situations 3 where wearing a face covering would seriously interfere in the performance of the person's public safety responsibilities; and 4 5 (7) Any member of a group of persons who are in an indoor retail business together and live in the same household or are a party of ten less, so long as the group 6 7 maintains a continuous physical distance of at least six feet from all other persons 8 not part of the household or party.
- 9 **Section 4. Repealer.** This Act is repealed on April 30, 2021.
- 10 **Section 5.** Whereas, this Act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
- health, or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in full force
- 12 and effect from and after its passage and approval.
